There was a fair market, with good prices for everything. Geese ranged all the way from \$2.50 to \$5.00, ducks from \$1.25 to \$1.75 fowl 80 cents to \$1.50 each, pork 2 1/2 cents for the best; beef (retail) 18 to 25 cents, by the carcass 14 to 20 cents; lamb, small, 23 to 30 cents and by the carcass 25 cents; hay 90 to \$1.00 per cwt.; straw 50 to 60 cents; potatoes 60 to 65 cents and oats 80 to 85 cents.
