REV. FREDERICK MILES CLAY

The death of Rev. Frederick Miles Clay occurred in Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, Saturday, January 30th, 1932.

Mr. Clay was born in Halifax, Nova Scotia, Dec. 6th, 1865, the son of the late Rev. Dr. Edwin and Sophia Pineo and grandson of the late Hon. H. J. Pineo. His childhood was spent in Halifax, the family later moving to Pughwash, N. S. In 1887 Mr. Clay married Deborah Louise, daughter of the late Angus Brien and Mary Lowther of Victoria, P. E. I. For several years Mr. Clay followed the sea holding a Master Mariner's certificate. In 1900 Mr. Clay was ordained to the Christian ministry, after having attended the Moody Bible Institute in Chicago, Illinois, U. S. A. He held pastorates in Maine, Pennsylvania, New York, Massachusetts and his last pastorate being in Virginia. Mr. Clay was much in demand as a lecturer. He possessed an unusually keen mind which was a storehouse of much of the best in literature and he had a sympathetic interest in all humanity. His mind and heart were also richly stored with Bible wisdom, and his gift for leadership in public prayer will long be remembered. Mr. Clay possessed a God-given voice and always took great pleasure in singing, especially for the aged.

In 1910 Mr. Clay established the Minnie Clay Fresh Air Camp in memory of his daughter, who died in 1909 at the age of 16 years. During the summer months this camp cared for small children from the slums of New York City. During the World War Mr. Clay was in Y. M. C. A. work acting as Military Secretary and caring for the returned soldiers in Halifax. Mr. Clay was greatly interested in Boy Scouts, and had received the highest honor conferred by that organization. In 1916 while holding a pastorate in New York, Mr. Clay rescued a mother and three children from death during a runaway. For this heroism he was awarded a Carnegie Bronze Medal. It was during this rescue Mr. Clay received the injuries which resulted in his death. "Greater love hath no man than this; that a man lay down his life for his friends."

Mr. Clay is survived by his widow and three daughters, Edna C. Faxon of Lee, Massachusetts, Rena C. Goodridge of Newfane, New York, Ruth C. Neary of Nampa, Idaho, one son, Harry V. Clay of Bangor, Maine, six grandchildren, two brothers, Edwin of Vancouver, British Columbia and Dr. Havelock of Saskatchewan. The funeral services were held Thursday afternoon at two o'clock from his late home in Victoria, Prince Edward Island, and were very largely attended. They were in charge of Rev. Mr. Crossman of the Baptist Church, assisted by Rev. Mr. Bridgewater of Saint John's Episcopal Church and Rev. Mr. Ayers of the United Church. The combined choirs of these churches sang "When the Roll is Called Up Yonder" and "Some Day We'll Understand." Mrs. Richard Metcalf sang "Shadows" as a solo. Following this service the True Brothers Lodge of Masons took charge and their beautiful and impressive service was used. Mr. Clay being a 32° Mason. There were many floral tributes among them being the Masonic emblem. Interment was made in the family plot in Victoria Cemetery. The bearers were Webster Bolter, Edward Boswell, Miner McNevin, Albert Sharon, William Lea and Cran Wright.
