He has combined with it a strong appeal for a nobler and higher appreciation of the gift of life, giving the story, the moral effectiveness of a sermon. Their program of songs and music was a real treat to music lovers. Special mention might be made of the solos. It is enough by Mendelssohn, the Death Army, by Groters and Abide With Me by Lidale, also I picked a flower Composed by Mr. Williams himself. All accompaniments were beautifully played by Mr. Hopkins. Owing to the usual snowstorm only a small audience was able to be present. Messrs Williams and Hopkins drove to catch a train going to Charlottetown and so were able to keep their appointment in Hertz Hall on Tuesday night. They left on Wednesday morning for Springhill, N. S.

On the train that was held up by the snow-storm on Monday night, between Preetown and Kensington, no one was more disappointed than Rev. D. L. Griffiths who had looked forward with happy anticipations to meeting the two talented Welsh singers, who presented their unique program in the United Church on that evening. PARIS, March 16.—The condemnation of the Assize Court of Leon of a blind prisoner to five years' imprisonment is the latest chapter in a moving North of France drama. It began in the Commune of Moncau-les-Loupe, in the Aisne Department, where Alfred Helin, aged 23, and the blacksmith's daughter, Raymonde Veron, aged 15, loved one another. The projected marriage was stoutly opposed by the blacksmith. The young couple decided to die together and one day in May last Helin shot the girl and then turned the revolver against himself. Both recovered from their wounds, but the young man was permanently blinded. He was charged with attempted murder and suicide, but the local court, touched by the pathetic circumstances gave him the benefit of the French equivalent of the First Offenders' Act. 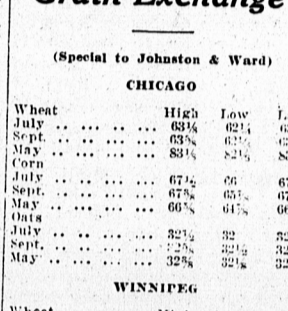

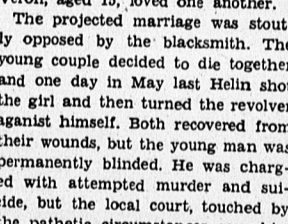
