What will prove to be the most interesting game yet played in the three-cornered hockey league will take place in Alexandra rink tomorrow night, when Glace Bay and Waterford meet. Waterford, it is said, will play Jimmy Williams, the fast skating wing man of last year's New Glasgow team, and another new player, named McLeod, formerly of Inverness, Glace Bay will have practically the same team as played Tuesday, but they expect with a fair and impartial referee to trim Hugh Dan's Colts, even if Williams is played. The Colts are out for the championship, and so are the Glace Bay team, and the team that wins tomorrow night will have a mighty good look-in for that honor. The program for the big forestry convention, at Ottawa, Feb. 7 and 8, which Supt. Clarke of the Charlottetown Experimental Farm has left to attend, is now complete. The subject of how to handle our forests, so as to get the most out of them, both now and in the future, will be dealt with by leaders from Canada and from the United States. Among those who will speak are Gifford Pinchot, formerly chief forester of the United States; E. A. Sterling, forester of the Pennsylvania Railroad, which is now growing its own ties; Dr. Fernow, head of the forestry school, of Toronto University; Dr. J. W. Robertson, of the Conservation Commission, and H. R. MacMillan, of the forestry branch of the department of the interior. The banquet on Wednesday evening, will be attended by parliamentary leaders, educationists, foresters, lumbermen and the heads of financial and commercial institutions. The day sessions are open to the public, and the importance which the government attaches to this subject is shown by the fact that these are held in the railway committee room of the parliament buildings; while the railways have granted special rates to delegates. The Seed Growers' Association, convene on Feb. 8 and 9, so that delegates to the forestry convention will be able to attend some of sessions of that body.

The Metropolitan Church of Toronto has extended an invitation to Rev. J. W. Aikens, well known in this city, to become its pastor at the close of Dr. Armstrong's term, which will be in June, 1912. At present Mr. Aikens is Associate Secretary of the Temperance and Moral Reform Department, a position to which he has been appointed a year and a half ago. He was born and educated in Ontario, but upon entering the ministry in 1884, the ranks were somewhat crowded in Toronto and other central conferences, and the way opened for him to go to Nova Scotia where he did faithful service at Petite Riviere, Hantsport, Port Maitland. His first appointment of prominence was in Truro, where his success was so marked that he was called to Brunswick Street Church, Halifax. His next pastorate was at Amherst, but he was called to a consessional office only a few months after commencing his work. Of course the question of transfer will have to be considered, as Mr. Aikens is a member of the Nova Scotia Conference, but it is expected that this can be satisfactorily arranged. The Metropolitan is the finest Methodist Church in Toronto, and probably in the whole Dominion. It has for many years occupied an out-standing position in the denomination and was recently the scene of the Ecumenical Conference. It has been generously supported by many of Toronto's wealthiest citizens and while it has now become one of the downtown churches with the downtown problem there is believed to be a great future ahead of the congregation. The selection of Mr. Aikens by the board for the work in hand is widely approved.
