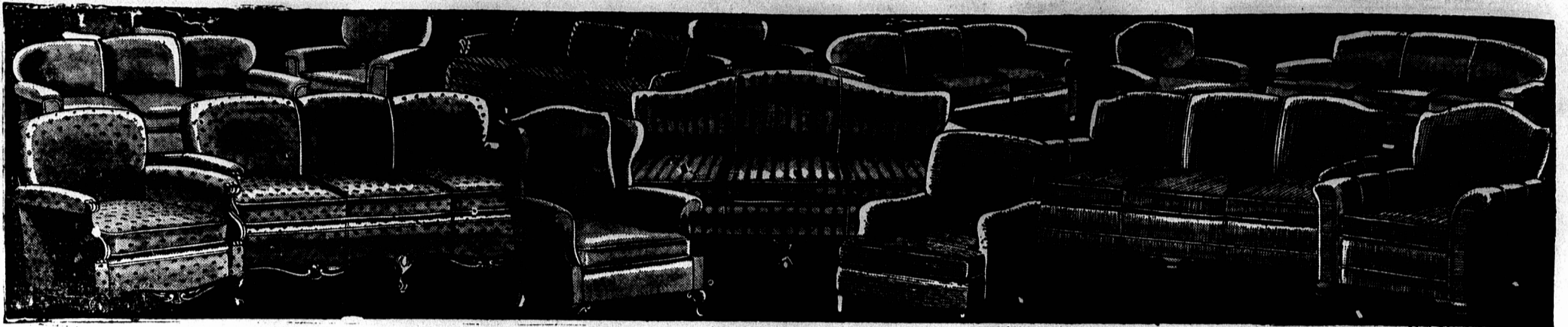

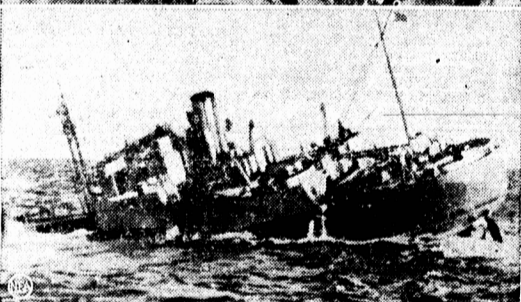

Body Reorganized

OTTAWA, Jan. 24 — (CP) — The Prices Board announced today that Wartime Food Corporation Limited, a Crown company, has been reorganized in order to give primary producers and organized labor direct representation on the Board of Directors.

The new president of the company is R. T. Mohan, President of General Foods Ltd., who is also administrator of tea, coffee and spices. K. W. Taylor, co-ordinator, foods administration is vice-president and the other directors are Raoul Godbout, president of Horticultural Society of Canada, A. R. Johnstone, vice-president of Canada of the International Union of Hotel and Restaurant Workers; E. W. Smart, administrator of wholesale trade; S. R. Noble, vice-president of Commodity Prices Stabilization Corporation Limited, and Carl Sanders, president of Gamble-Robinson Limited.

The new general manager is J. B. Lander, manager of Canadian Fruit Distributors Limited, Regina. A. N. H. James, of Barclays Bank has been appointed secretary treasurer.

The corporation, a subsidiary of Commodity Prices Stabilization Corporation Limited, was created to facilitate price control and equitable distribution of food.
