## QUEBEC'S BAD FIRE

Six Families Are Made Homeless  
ONE FATALLY BURNED

Awful Explosion Of Dynamite At The Steel Works, Sydney, C. B.

FATAL DYNAMITE EXPLOSION.  
SYDNEY, C. B. Jan. 22.—(Special).—Angus McDougall was killed and a man named Morine from Trilby Bay, Newfoundland badly injured by a dynamite explosion at the steel works to-day.

FATAL FIRE IN QUEBEC.  
QUEBEC, Jan. 22.—(Special).—Four houses occupied by six families were burned out to-day, losing every thing and one woman, Mrs. Cantin, will die from burns received.

## EMPIRE MOURNS A SOVEREIGN DEAD!

Her Most Gracious Majesty the Queen Died Yesterday Afternoon at 6.30 O'Clock at Osborne House.

REGAINED CONSCIOUSNESS AT NOON AND SAID "GOOD-BYE."

A Momentous Message to Prince of Wales—Solemn Prayer at the Bedside—Notable Personages Present—"She Paid the Penalty of Devotion to the State"—Her Unceasing Labors and the Cares That Yoke with Empire—Parliament to Meet at Once—Ceremonies of Accession—U. S. Senate Resolution—The Flag Half Masted on the Executive Mansion—The World Darkened With Mourning for the Best of Sovereigns.

• COWES, ISLE OF WIGHT, January 22.—(Special)—The Queen died at six thirty o'clock this afternoon, surrounded by her children and grandchildren.

HER LAST WORDS TO THE PRINCE OF WALES.  
At noon the Queen addressed a few words of great moment to the Prince of Wales and then said "Good Bye" to all others in the room.

SOLEMN PRAYERS FOR THE DYING QUEEN.  
The Bishop of Winchester and Rector of Whippingham were present and offered the prayers for those in extremis.

NOTABLE PERSONS AT THE ROYAL BEDSIDE.  
Among those around bedside were.—  
The Prince and Princess of Wales;  
The Princess Louise;  
The Princess Battenburg;  
The Princess Beatrice;  
The Duke of Connaught;  
The Emperor of Germany;  
Prince Christian;  
The Royal Physicians, Ladies of the Court and some faithful attendants including the Queen's Indian attendant.

PRIVY COUNCIL AND PARLIAMENT TO MEET.  
All arrangements are practically completed for the meeting of the Privy Council and of Parliament, which will assemble within twenty-four hours.

MINISTERS WILL TAKE THE OATH OF ALLEGIANCE.  
The Ministers will give up their seals of office to be re-sworn, taking the oath of allegiance to the King. They will receive the Proclamation of the new King and will pass votes of condolence and adjourn.

ANCIENT CUSTOMS REPEATED AT THE ACCESSION.  
The expectation is that all the ancient customs will be adhered to in connection with the Prince's Accession to the Throne.  
SHE PAID THE PENALTY OF DEVOTION.  
All the newspapers devote columns to historical and personal reminiscences of

the Queen and all agree that she has paid the penalty of her great devotion to the affairs of state.

THE QUEEN'S GREAT LABORS—THE CARES OF EMPIRE.  
She signed fully 50,000 documents yearly, or an average of 100 daily. These were frequently of great moment and many of them required patient examination before signing.  
She always kept in close touch with all her work as Sovereign.

THE KING'S MESSAGE TO THE LORD MAYOR.  
Immediately on the Queen's death Albert Edward notified the Lord Mayor of London and received a touching message of sympathy in reply.

LEO JOND REGRET AND RESPECT AT WASHINGTON.  
WASHINGTON, Jan. 22.—(Special).—The news of the Queen's death was heard here with profound regret.

The flag on the Executive Mansion was placed at half mast, the first time in history that this mark of respect was ever paid to a foreign Ruler.

MESSAGE OF SYMPATHY FROM SECRETARY HAY.  
Secretary of State Hay in the name of the American people sent a message of sympathy to Ambassador Ocheate.

UNITED STATES SENATE'S RESOLUTION.  
The Senate unanimously passed a resolution "that the death of Her Royal and Imperial Majesty Victoria, of noble, virtuous and great renown, is sincerely deplored by the Senate of the United States of America."

ALL CANADIAN FLAGS AT HALF MAST.  
OTTAWA, Jan. 22.—(Special).—Flags are ordered to be displayed at half mast all over Canada until sunset of the day of Her Majesty's funeral.

CROWN OFFICIALS IN CANADA CONTINUE IN OFFICE.  
A proclamation of the Secretary of State continues in office all persons employed by the Crown and the oath of allegiance will be administered to all who must take it again.

## AFRICAN UNION

Now Favored by the Boer Leaders.  
BRITISH RULE FIXED.  
More Canadians Ill at Cape Town and Bloemfontein, South Africa.

CANADIAN SOLDIERS ILL.  
OTTAWA Jan. 22.—(Special).—Sergt. Major Forrest and Sergt. Ayr. Canadian scouts are dangerously ill at Cape Town and Fernoe of the Strathcona Horse at Bloemfontein.

BENDING TO THE INVITABLE.  
CAPE TOWN, Jan 22.—(Special).—Merriman has sailed for Europe. It is believed he has been instructed by the majority to bend to the advice of Kruger and Fisher accept and terms other than independence, as they recognize that British rule is a fixity.

AFRICAN FEDERATION FAVORED.  
Merriman and his friends want to avoid the Crown Colony form of government and favor an African Confederation.
