EDITORIAL NOTES.

The resolutions adopted by the Baptist Association condemning the License Act and commending THE GUARDIAN are as gall and wormwood to the Pioneer. It hesitates, however, to assail the Association very severely. The tone of its article shows the Pioneer to be "willing to wound but yet afraid to strike."

The horseless carriage is coming into use rapidly in all the great cities and a short name is needed for it. Motor carriage, auto-mobile and motor vehicle have been suggested and none of these are quite satisfactory. The Boston Herald predicts that the name will be settled in the same way that cabriolet has shrunk to cab, bicycle to bike, telephone to phone and pantaloons to pants. Automobile is to diminish to "moba." Lingual purists will protest but the great democracy will settle this as they have settled so many other matters.

So far in its opposition to the License Act THE GUARDIAN has had the endorsement of the Methodist District of Summerside, the Baptist Association of P. E. Island, the Grand Lodge of Good Templars, the Temperance Alliance and a number of Lodges and Divisions of temperance. So far as we have noticed the only persons except Hon. Donald Farquharson, who have written for publication over their own signatures in support of the License Act have been Gabriel McDonald and George Muttart.

The Patriot tells that the Provincial Government have decided to hold an official investigation into the past and present management of the Insane Hospital. A commission will be appointed who will take testimony under oath. Much good may come of a full investigation, impartially conducted with open doors and at which all parties concerned shall be fairly represented. We have no doubt that any honest effort of the Government to improve the Lunatic Hospital and other public institutions will be duly appreciated and endorsed.

A proposed amendment to the Canadian criminal law favored by the Minister of Justice is the adoption of the British system of tickets of leave. Under this plan prisoners who are in for long terms and who behave well could be let out on condition of reporting themselves at stated intervals to the authorities, but would be liable to instant arrest and imprisonment if they broke the law. It is thought this might be an incentive to reform, especially in youthful convicts, and that it would also diminish the cost of maintaining the prison population. All ticket of leave men would be compelled to support themselves.

La Patrie, Mr. Tarte's Montreal organ, confirms the previous statement of Le Soleil that the supplementary estimates will amount to \$7,000,000 and gives some particulars including the following: Elevators at Montreal and Port Colborne, to be under Government control; harbor works at Port Colborne; improvements of Montreal harbor and the channel thence to Quebec: \$1,000,000 towards a bridge across the river at Quebec; railway subsidies in Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick.

The Pioneer in its zeal for the License Act hints at the possibility of the Scott Act being repealed in Prince and King's Counties. Of course! That is the first thought of the liquor sellers' minds as in the Pioneer's. It is claimed that it was part of the deal made two years ago when then the Scott Act was abrogated in this city. Apparently the Pioneer desires to have a Provincial License law ready for the emergency when its friends, the liquor men in and out of the legislature, shall succeed in their schemes.

The London Economist, an ably conducted journal distinctly friendly to the United States, has no very high opinion of the military management in the West Indies and the Philippines, It says:

Since our own Crimean muddle there has been no worse instance of military mismanagement than that displayed by the American war department in Cuba and the Philippines. We do not know how far Gen. Otis has been responsible for the serious friction in the Philippines, or how far Secretary Alger here, as in Cuba, has been to blame. What we

do see is that there has been a complete and almost unpardonable miscalculation, and that, rightly or wrongly, the blame will be visited on President McKinley, who is, of course, politically responsible for all that is going on.

THE SQUADRON.
