THE Steamer City of Ghent arrived here Friday evening, and left at midnight on return for Halifax, taking away 150 bags oats and potatoes, 88 cases lobsters, shipped by Messrs. D. Rogers & Sons to Liverpool, England, and a quantity of sundries.

A Posse consisting of some 13 special constables, headed by Deputy Sheriff Queen left here during the early hours of Saturday morning to evict a family living near Campbellton. Several unsuccessful attempts had previously been made and resisted with considerable force. At latest accounts Saturday evening no progress had been made further than breaking some windows and arranging the siege. It is expected they will have an interesting time.

THE Schr. Minnie Scott, Capt. Grant, (owner), of Shediac, which cleared from Summerside last Monday, for Cape Traverse, loaded with lumber for Mr. Geo. Burton, sprang a leak when within several miles of her destination. The crew succeeded in getting her into Cape Traverse, but were obliged to beach her near the wharf to prevent her sinking. The cargo was saved, and is now being hauled off with teams, but the vessel is a total wreck.

THE social and entertainment given by the members of the Britannia Amateur Athletic Association Thursday evening was a very enjoyable affair. Mr. R. H. Campbell presided and opened the proceedings with an address to the boys. A vocal solo was very pleasingly rendered by Master Harry Sterns, who possesses a magnificent voice for one so young. Rev. J. M. Withycombe gave one of his pleasantest and most practical addresses. Misses I. Gough and Bessie Morris sang a duet which was well received and generously applauded. A harmonica solo by Master Bernard Gillis and a cornet solo by Master Jas. McKinnon followed by ice cream and refreshments brought the entertainment to a close.
