**Trenchant Review Of Saunders Government's Mismanagement By Dr. W. J. McMillan In Budget Debate.**

**AUDITOR'S STATEMENTS**  
 Statements of that kind, Mr. Speaker, will not get any one anywhere. It does not get the Provincial Auditor anywhere, either. Probably if the Provincial Auditor would spend as much time on the preparation of his own accounts as he does in gossip, we wouldn't have an edition of the Public Accounts put out such as we have presented to us this year; full of misprints and errors. It is no credit to the Government, let me tell you. I do not think the Government members are personally responsible; I believe the responsible party is the Provincial Auditor. If an auditor is not able to put out a statement of the Public Accounts that is correct, what is he there for? I don't care who he is, my hon. friends have talked facetiously about a loose leaf system. Do you see the loose leaf in this? (Indicating copy of Public Accounts, 1929.) There is a loose leaf system, all right.

Let my hon. friend from Rustico turn to page 7 of the Public Accounts and let him add up the figures \$1,050,954.79 plus \$9,000 and see what he will get. Will he get what is in the Public Accounts? It is very creditable, isn't it? Let him turn over then to the items for Queens County Jail, where he will find that "Mrs. Burr Dwyer" is the keeper of that jail with a salary of \$780; that "Burr Dwyer" is assistant keeper with a salary of \$100, and that Daniel J. MacDonald is also an assistant keeper with a salary of \$416.67. And I would like my hon. friend from Rustico to note this particularly, that "Joseph Shreenan" is the matron of that institution, with a salary of \$50.

**HON. MR. MCINTYRE:** Don't you know there is an Act passed this year providing that "he" means "she" and "she" means "he".  
**DR. MCMILLAN:** That accounts for it! That is the reason my hon. friend from Rustico can qualify as the mother of the Saunders Prohibition Act and Joseph Shreenan can qualify as "matron" of the Queens County Jail. (Laughter.) They want a matron out there, Mr. Speaker, because they are a very sick crowd. If you turn to the Queens County jail expenditure for the past year you will find that \$400 was spent in medicine; out there, I notice, too, that in the Summerside jail they got no medicine. At least, there is none charged against them in the Public Accounts. They got molasses and moonshine, and other things like that; but out in our jail they required a lot of medicine. I suppose that is the order under the new regime, with Joseph Shreenan as matron.

**Other Errors Pair**  
 You can go all through the Accounts and you will find similar ridiculous errors. You will find that the poor Minister of Public Works gets no salary. Neither does his Deputy; but read down a little further and you notice that Chief Engineer Shaw gets \$2,000 and the stenographer, Mrs. E. Gallant, gets \$2,000. It is not very creditable that a Government should turn out a set of Public Accounts like that. The Premier says that on one occasion we made a mistake of \$47,000 and had to call in the Public Accounts and reprint the page. I think it would have been a good thing if those accounts had been called in before being sent out to the public. Then they wouldn't have to account for a male "matron" in the Queens County Jail, and there would have been fewer mistakes all through the report.

But the real beginning of this loose leaf system occurred under the Bell Government in 1922. In the report of the external auditor for that year there was one item of \$125,000 left out of the reckoning and they had to recall that statement and issue a correct one. Copies of that original report are very valuable now. I have saved mine carefully, and I am going to have it placed over in the new Library, just as soon as they get the museum section fitted up. I will save my copy of the 1929 Public Accounts with the loose leaf correction, for the same purpose.

million dollars, in the Public Works Department alone. Look at the amount they are getting out of the motor vehicle account, \$106,000 last year; gasoline account, another \$106,000 over \$100,000 more than we received. They are receiving over \$20,000 from succession duties; a great deal more than we received. I don't know why it is that so many rich people have died since this Government came into power, but in that one item alone, you will find that they are getting a great increase in revenue. And they are spending it, too! They are making it fly! They all bewail the fact that they have not enough money, and they blame the Stewart Government for it. The Minister of Agriculture says we didn't know anything about the qualifications of statemanship, that we took the poll tax off and thereby bought the people with their own money. We are not even satisfied with that, but when we were going out of power we cut off the land tax and lost another \$40,000 in revenue. That was his statement, Mr. Speaker, but like some other statements of the Minister of Agriculture it was not correct. If you look at the land tax collections today compared with when we were in power you will find a difference of less than \$20,000. It is true we reduced the taxes on land, as we promised to do. We also raised the exemption on salaried people, and we increased the grant to the orphanages, the public health organizations, etc. All that means less revenue. We accept full responsibility for those measures; but I do not think the Premier or any other member of this House has a right to say that we lost \$40,000 by reducing the land tax.

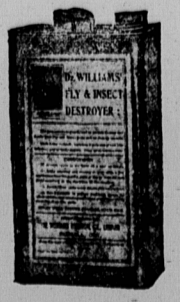

**Prices Crash On N. Y. Exchange**

(Special to the Guardian)  
**TORONTO, Ont., June 16**—New York prices crashed during the first half of the session today when nearly a hundred stocks made new low records for the year 1930 and many of them broke through their low points of last year. Canadian interest in the New York market followed the trend of the New York leaders and nickel came back to \$23 a share in the early afternoon. Brazilian sold lower and Noranda went below \$25. United States steel made a new low for the year in New York when the selling gathered force after an opening in which prices showed a tendency to drift lower. Steel got down to \$160 and a fraction in the morning session. Prices dragged as trading picked up in volume and the ticker lagged behind the growing accumulation of orders around midday. U. S. steel broke through its resistance level at 160 shortly before 1 p. m. today and sold at 159 3/8, the lowest level since last December. At the time this report came from the floor of the exchange the stock ticker was printing a sale of U. S. Steel at 160 for 10,000 shares, a transaction involving \$1,600,000. All markets were under pressure with the prices of grain and cotton going lower.

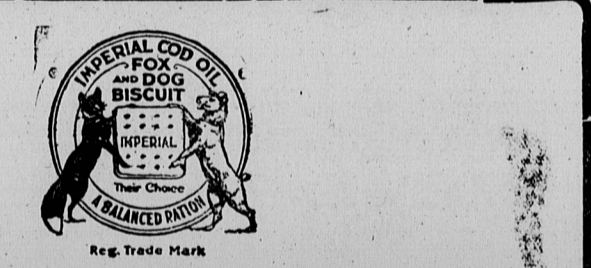
