### Address And Presentation

On the evening of June 11th quite a number of friends gathered at the home of Mr. John J. Campbell of Elmira to wish him many happy returns of the day, it being the anniversary of his 87th year. After every person had been seated Mr. Raymond McPhee was appointed chairman and in a few well chosen remarks explained the object of the present gathering of friends. Having done so he then called upon Rev. E. J. Macdonald to read the address after which congratulations and remarks were extended to Mr. Campbell by Mr. George B. McEachern, Mr. N. S. McPhee and several others who were present for the occasion and after having satisfied the inner man to a very fine repast gotten up by Mrs. Columbia Campbell all repaired to their respective homes. Following is the address:

Mr. John J. Campbell, Elmira, P. E. I.  
Dear Mr. Campbell: We a small number of your friends gathered here on this the occasion of your eighty-seventh birthday, congratulate you most sincerely, for having already passed so many milestones beyond the allotted span of years. We are greatly pleased to find you enjoying the mental and physical capabilities which well

might be the envy of anyone more than thirty years your junior.

It is difficult for those of us who meet you daily to realize that you have reached such a great age, as we find you more mentally alert, more conversant with current events, as well as more community and public spirited than the average man of much less mature years.

A Gentleman of the Old School: We congratulate you on the excel-

lent family you have reared; on the splendid home you have built, which has its corner stone laid on good Scottish Hospitality; a trait in which you have always excelled and which thousands have enjoyed within its walls.

This address is all too brief to embody the many kind things that could be expressed about you but as we hope to be celebrating many more of your birthdays we will now conclude by asking you to please accept this small memento of the occasion and our best wishes for your continued health and happiness.
