For many years past the officials reports of the debates of both the Senate and Commons of Canada have been printed and distributed. The direct cost to the Senate was about \$14,000, and to the Commons about \$15,000 a total of \$29,000. In salaries along the cost was over \$36,000. The consequential cost was much greater as has been found in all public bodies where the officials debates are published. Members who speak are induced to speak more frequently and at greater length because their speeches in this way are carried to the country and they think their importance increased thereby. Thus the debates and the sessions of Parliament are prolonged at a cost far beyond the cost of reporting and printing the debates. The entire cost of Hansard is not less than \$100,000 to \$125,000 yearly. We may admit that there is a public advantage in having an authorized record of what our leading public men say in Parliament. So there would be an advantage in having a fairly good report of what is said by the political leaders in their campaign speeches throughout the country. But almost every important speech delivered either in Parliament or on the platform is sufficiently reported in the leading newspapers of the country. Some thirty or forty capable journalists attend every session of Parliament and give to their readers a fairly full synoptical report of all the speeches that are worth reading. Hansard on the contrary, is loaded down with a vast mass of verbiage and valueless talk which scarcely anybody but the proof-reader will waste his time in reading.

The press in Canada gives up three times as much of its space to reporting the proceedings of Parliament as the United States press gives to reporting the sayings and doings of their Congress. In fact the leading dailies of the Republic do not find it of interest to their readers to give up any considerable space to the Congressional debates. An exceptionally good or important speech is reported; how members vote and the measures that are being considered receive a fair analysis. With us in Canada the newspapers give the general reader as much as he wants of parliamentary talk, and would give more if there were no Hansard. We venture that of the thousands of copies of the official debates circulated daily from Ottawa not one in ten is read through by the persons receiving them.

We note that it is proposed by some to abolish Hansard and add the cost of it to the pay of members. This would be a lame and illogical conclusion. The only valid plea for increasing members' pay is that the sessions have grown longer than they were. If Hansard were abolished

the sessions would certainly be shortened, and the main ground for increased indemnity would be swept away. Hansard exists not for the country's sake but for the politicians' sake. The country will not cry on account of abolition nor petition for its renewal. And when it is abolished the country will want the money that Hansard now costs expended for more useful purposes than increasing members' pay.

The cold storage of furs has become an extensive industry in the larger cities. As the temperature is kept constantly below the freezing point there is no need of the use of tarred paper, camphor, cedar or other moth preventives, and the furs are produced when needed free from all odor. Besides, furs are improved by being kept in the cold and are always more or less injured by heat. Some of the cold storage plants for furs are quite extensive.

The Erie Canal is the American rival of the Canadian St. Lawrence river and canal system. The Canadian route has now a depth of 14 feet of water. The Erie Canal extends from the Hudson River at Albany, to the lake Erie at Buffalo, a distance of 350 miles and has a depth of seven feet. It has been proposed to deepen the canal to nine feet at a cost of \$26,000,000. This proposition has been emphatically repudiated by the Canal Association of Greater New York which has declared in favor of deepening the canal to 12 feet at a cost of \$62,000,000. Even if this were done the Canadian waterway would have the immense advantage of much shorter canals and two feet greater depth, sufficient to allow ocean going steamers to pass from the Upper lakes to the sea.
