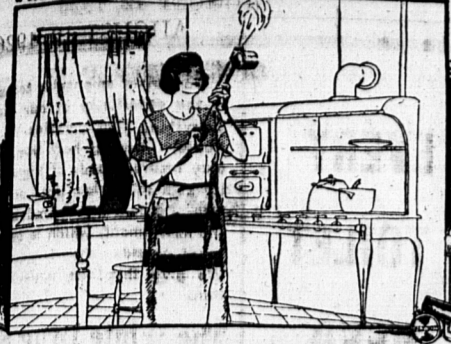

LADY WINDERMERE'S FAN AT PRINCE EDWARD A Perfect Photoplay With a Perfect Musical Setting.

Admirers of Ernst Lubitsch have now another reason to say there is nothing this master director of the screen cannot do. This is because "Lady Windermere's Fan," his latest production for Warner Bros. which opened yesterday at the Prince Edward Theatre is a perfect photoplay in spite of the sceptics who wagged mournful heads at the thought of Oscar Wilde's brilliant and famous epigrams transferred to the screen.

"Lady Windermere's Fan," written thirty years ago, is a thoroughly modern story of a beautiful woman's determined and successful effort to gain an entry into the society that has scorned her. Her charm wins her friends when she forces her way into the birthday party of Lady Windermere, and she is determined to succeed in her ultimate happiness for the woman who risked everything she desired most, for love of her daughter.

Ernst Lubitsch's direction is really a masterpiece of perfect direction. Lubitsch has helped transform her into a gorgeously beautiful and sophisticated woman of the world, and her characterization of Mrs. King is so full of repressed fire and subtle mischief, that it is almost impossible to recall that she has been known as the "most deserted wife" on the screen. Miss Rich's performance is on a par with that of Mrs. Erynn.

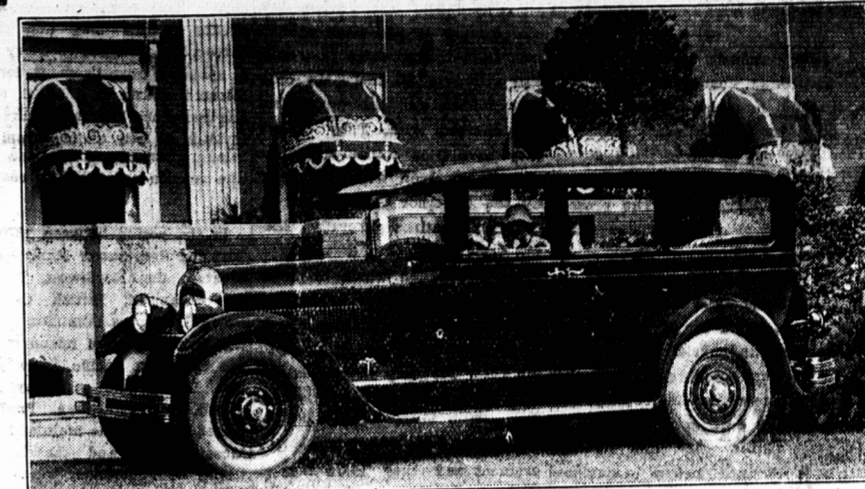
In spite of May McAvoy's determined little chin and strong personality, her delicate beauty still labels her as sweet. That she is not being misused so often, is the work of her director, who belongs to the actress alone. Miss McAvoy as Lady Windermere is delightful in the role of the proud wife whose impulsive flight is saved from disaster by the sacrifice of that indiscreet Mrs. Erynn.

Ronald Colman, thanks to the courtesy of Samuel Goldwyn, was free to give one of the best performances of his brilliant career as King in "Daringly." In his handsome stateroom, Colman makes a most effective finished performance. Julien Josephson adapted "Lady Windermere's Fan," and so carefully and adroitly has this task been done, that the story of a mother's sacrifice for her daughter is as powerful and freshly fascinating as when it was produced on the stage some thirty years ago.

Fusion Campaign Is Unsuccessful

Manitoba Electors Not Enamored of Liberal Scheme. WINNIPEG, Man., Aug. 11. - In the last Parliament the Province of Manitoba was represented by seven Conservatives, seven Progressives, one Liberal and two Communists. The Conservative Party polled almost as many votes as Liberals. Progressives and Communists combined. In the present fight an attempt is being made to fuse the Liberal, Progressive and Communist forces against the Conservative Party, and as far as candidates are concerned this will probably be successful, but it is far from being successful among the electors. Three classes name Liberals, conservative Progressives and Trades-Unionists, object to such a fusion, and are rallying to the support of Conservative candidates. The Conservative Party more enthusiastic and better organized than in Manitoba, while their opponents are divided over which of the groups will have the candidate. The Conservative leaders claim that they will increase the Conservative representation from seven to twelve, and some of the more optimistic claim 14. That Robert Forke, Progressive leader, will be defeated in Brandon is taken as assured by the Conservatives and several other Progressives, such as J. L. Brown, Lisgar, W. T. Bird, Nelson, A. L. Beaubien, Provencher, and James Steedman. Souris, will be among the fallen. They are also confident of defeating J. S. Woodsworth, North Centre Winnipeg and A. A. Heaps, North Winnipeg.
