THE BALLOT.

Those who oppose the ballot do so mainly from sinister or party motives and they are fighting for a losing cause, one which must inevitably be defeated.

TORONTO WORLD VIEWS.

The Toronto World is strongly opposed to reciprocity, and after sizing up the situation at Ottawa and Washington confidently predicts that the agreement will not be ratified.

As to the situation at Ottawa, the World affirms that it will be impossible to ratify the agreement in time for Sir Wilfrid Laurier to go to London in May and should he decide to continue Parliament in session during May and June there is still less chance of the agreement going through.

The World moreover hints at obstructive tactics by the Opposition by which they "could easily hold Parliament in session to head off so momentous a proposition."

RIOTS IN RIO JANEIRO WITH FATAL RESULTS. RIC JANEIRO, March 14—Anti-Clerical riots occurred at Sao Paulo, yesterday. The military and police were attacked by the mob, which fought. In the encounter a number of persons were killed and others injured. One hundred and fifty arrests were made. All the churches in Sao Paulo have been placed under military guard. The rioting originated in the disappearance from a parochial school of a young girl who could not be produced by the school authorities when demanded.
