CANADIAN STEEL SHIPS.

It is highly gratifying to learn that there is good prospect that within the next few years several large plants for the construction of steel ships will be in operation in Canada. During his recent visit to this country Sir Christopher Furness of the famous Furness Line is reported to have arranged with the Clergue concern at Sault Ste Marie for the erection of a \$10,000,000 shipbuilding plant and steel works at that point, the raw material for which is to be supplied by Canadian iron and coal fields. Another enterprise in which American and Canadian capital are jointly concerned is the Camp-Ontario Steel works at Collingwood, Ontario, where shipbuilding is to be carried on on a large scale. At the same time a project is taking shape for utilizing Canadian coal and Sydney made steel in an extensive shipbuilding plant at Halifax or some other convenient Maritime Province port.

Hitherto British capital has been rather shy of investment in Canadian industries, and the Furness-Clergue undertaking at the Soo is the more noteworthy on that account. It also indicates that British ship-builders, who have been and are now doing so large a share of the world's ship-building have already directed their attention to Canada as a probable location where this great industry can be most economically carried on. With both American and British capital seeking the Canadian field in friendly rivalry in the ship-building industry it is difficult to predict the extent to which Canada may become a producer of steel ships within the next decade. This is just what we want in this country.

The by-election for the Commons in York, N. B., is to be polled on December 28th, three days after Christmas. Mr. Gibson, who was unseated, will be the Liberal candidate and Rev. Dr. McLeod, who opposed Mr. Gibson at the last general election will be the Conservative candidate.

THE BRITON'S WAY.

Lord Rosebery on Some Disadvantages of English Methods—The National Self-Complacency.

In his speech at the distribution of prizes to the students of the Birmingham and Midland Institute, Lord Rosebery made several remarks which have since been widely discussed and generally with approbation. Speaking of the Briton's "national self-complacency," he said:

"The nation which is satisfied is lost. The nation which is not progressing is retrograding. Rest and be thankful is a motto which spells decay."

"The New World seems to possess more of this quality of progressive-ness, in its crude state, at any rate, than the old. In individuals it sometimes seems to be carried to excess. I do not by this mean the revolutions which periodically ravage the Southern and Central American Republics. I think more of the restless enterprise of the United States, with the devouring anxiety to improve existing machinery and existing methods, and the apparent impossibility of accumulating any fortune, however gigantic, which shall satisfy or be sufficient to allow of leisure and repose."

"There the disdain of finality, the anxiety for improving on the best, seems almost a disease; but in Great Britain we can afford to catch the complaint, at any rate in a mitigated form, and give in exchange some of our own self-complacency, for complacency is a fatal gift. What was good enough for my father is good enough for me is a treasured English axiom which, if strictly carried out, would have kept us to wooden plows and water clocks. In these days we need to be inoculated with some of the nervous energy of the Americans. That is true of individuals, admittedly true, but is it not also true of the nation?"

Occasionally the nation wakes up and finds that its methods or machinery are out of date, and even decayed. It demands, or another should be placed up-to-date, and having made the demand it turns its attention to something else, or goes to slumber; then it wakes up again, finds that nothing has been done, grumbles, and perhaps swears, and turns its attention to something else or perhaps slumbers.

"There is a story of an English duke, the husband of an historic duchess, who was awakened with the news that his magnificent palace, in which he was then sleeping, was in flames. He expressed the hope that they would be put out, and turned round and went to sleep again. Now that in itself is not a bad form of phlegmatic courage, a passive force in itself, but it is a quality of strength which contains a peril. Our people in like manner when they are told that their house is on fire are apt to call loudly for a fire engine, but to fall asleep again directly it arrives."
