HATTIE LEBLANC GETS MANY PRESENTS

(Continued from page 1.) Boston paper?" On being assured of the contrary, she remarked, "Oh, those Boston newspaper men, they wouldn't leave me alone for a minute. We had to go over to Marblehead and take the train from there in order to escape them. I don't know of anything that I can say except that I am very glad this trial is over and that the jury believed my story that I did not commit the crime of which I was accused. I am glad to be on my way home and I never felt happier than I do now."

"Have you any plans for the future," Miss LeBlanc was asked. "I intend to stay home for a while, but I don't know yet what I shall do."

Miss LeBlanc talks with a pronounced French accent. She seemed anxious to avoid more publicity. One of the trainmen told the reporter that in talking with the girl she had said she would probably accept an offer of \$500 a week for an engagement in the theatrical work.

It was also stated that Miss LeBlanc had a very large amount of personal baggage, made up largely of presents that were sent to her during her trial and after her acquittal. Among these gifts it was said there was thirty sweaters, articles of jewelry and a considerable amount of money.

After a wait of about an hour in the train shed here the party resumed their journey to Cape Breton on the Atlantic express.

Hattie's father, who accompanied her from Cambridge said to the Post: "I am taking my poor little ill-treated daughter to her home, where I trust that in a short time she will forget this terrible thing which has come into her young life. I am positive my little girl did not commit the crime with which she was charged and my future will be devoted to lifting the heavy weight of this great tragedy from her life."

As the old gentleman finished, tears of sympathy for his daughter's great trial and gladness that she had escaped from the murderer's doom, coursed down his aged and shriveled cheeks and a thrill of answering sympathy from the train passengers echoed the sentiments which apparently welled from an old father's heart in thanking for a loved one's escape.

DROWNING ACCIDENT

(Continued from page 1.) placed the house in the desired location. Previous to this the two McRae boys and Coles had put on skates while Mr. Meek, a man more advanced in years than his companions, walked. On returning the latter was seated on the sleigh while the McRae boys and Coles skated and drew the sleigh along. At some distance behind these were followed by the Roy Meek and Michael Fogarty on foot.

When the four approached the channel it is said that Mr. Meek cautioned the boys about the ice or the direction in which they were going but they evidently assumed they were going all right. When over the channel, at a point where there is a strong current and where it is about ten feet in depth, the whole four broke through.

Fogarty and Meek, who were coming behind, rushed to the scene and with the aid of a short stick their only means for effecting a rescue which was available, they succeeded in getting Mr. Meek and Wilfrid McRae out of the water.

Alexander McRae, it seems, got hold of the stick when held out to him but, benumbed by the cold and weighted down by his waterlogged clothing, could not retain his grip and sank.

Young Coles sank immediately and his body was not seen afterwards until his body was recovered.

Both bodies were brought to the surface a short time after the accident but too late for any attempt at resuscitation to be effective. They were taken to the Spring Brook Hall, a short distance from the shore where the bodies were at the time The Guardian's enquiry was made last night.

It could not then be ascertained whether a coroner had been notified or not.

As a result of the sad occurrence the dark shadow of death enters into two homes and in these there prevails that deep feeling of sorrow which always accompanies death under such regrettable circumstances.

The two boys were popular with their fellows and beloved at home. Deep sympathy will be extended to the families of the deceased young men, both of whom are suddenly called on to endure a painful shock.

Alexander McRae, was a son of Hugh McRae, French River, and leaves his grief-stricken father and mother, six brothers and five sisters. These are: Wilfred, Stetson and Jack and two other young brothers at home, and William on a sealing vessel, and Mary and Florence in Stanley, Mrs. James Dennis, Southport, and two other young sisters at home.

On the news being broken to Mrs. McRae of the death of her son, her grief was so pronounced that it was necessary to secure the attendance of a physician.

Vernon Coles, was a son of John Coles, French River, and he, too leaves a father and mother to endure a sense of loss which they can hardly realize. He is also survived by two brothers and two sisters at home, some of whom are very young.

This terrible accident will call forth the heartfelt sympathy of all for the bereaved ones.

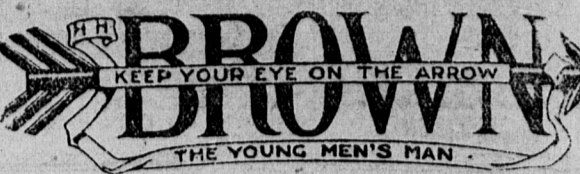
