Candidates whose names are marked with a star have not completed their matriculation, but will be allowed to attend College. They will be required to pass supplementary examinations in certain subjects in order to complete this examination before receiving a license to teach in the public schools.

Candidates whose names are published herein will be admitted at the opening of the college term, and may study for (a) teacher's license; or (b) a commercial certificate; or (c) the ordinary academic certificate leading to the more general education.

Students who in this examination have done well in arithmetic, and who may be found at the beginning of the sessions proficient in penmanship, will be offered in lieu of these subjects, a course in mechanical drawing at a cost for equipment not exceeding \$8.00.

Every student that purposes attending Prince of Wales College must fill out and return to the "Prince of Wales College, Charlottetown", the form which is found enclosed with the report card received from this matriculation examination, at once or at a date not later than August 20th, so that arrangements may be made for his classification and accommodation.

Prince of Wales College will open on Tuesday, September 7th, on which day at 2.00 p.m. all students of the third and fourth year classes will be enrolled, and classes formed. On Wednesday, September 8th, at 2.00 p.m. students of the second year will be enrolled; those from Charlottetown at 10.00 a.m. and those from the country at 2.00 p.m.

Students' fees will be payable at the College on the day of registration. In the case of third and fourth year students they may be paid half-yearly. For the first and second year students the fees for the ordinary courses are \$5.00 for country students and \$10.00 for students from Charlottetown, with an additional dollar of caution money for the male students. For commerce students the fees are \$20.00 for those from the country and \$35.00 for those from Charlottetown. For third year the fees are \$50.00 and \$75.00, and for the fourth year \$100.00 and \$150.00 respectively for country and Charlottetown students.

ONCE WERE DOZEN NOW 9,000 WOMEN LONDON, July 26 — After more than 40 years in the post office service Miss A. E. Cox, Superintendent of the Telephone Exchange Staff, London, has retired. For 16 years Miss Cox occupied the post of superintendent, at a salary of \$3,000 a year. There were only a dozen girls on the first post office telephone exchange in the city when Miss Cox began her career. In retirement there were 9,000 girls employed in the telephone service throughout London, all under her care.

Students wishing to obtain a teacher's license are advised that the minimum standard for the same in the other provinces of Canada requires at least two and generally three years of study after passing Grade X. The Board of Education in this province, however, still leave it possible for those students who are eighteen years of age, and who can make 65 per cent in the examinations of the first year course to obtain their license with but one year's attendance at the Prince of Wales College. To do this, however, only those candidates who have made at least 65 per cent at this present examination can be expected to be successful, and consequently young and immature students making a low pass mark in this examination should hesitate to come at this stage to Prince of Wales College, but should remain another year at school and obtain a better educational ground work before incurring the great expense of the course at College.

The public schools with six weeks' holidays will open on Monday, August 16. All other schools except those of Charlottetown and Summerside will open on Aug. 30.
