MANITOBA'S BORDERS HAVE BEEN ENLARGED.

OTTAWA, Nov. 22—Premier Roblin, of Manitoba has made the announcement that his government had reached an agreement with the Federal Administration in settlement of the Boundary Question. A bill to embrace this settlement will be introduced this session, and Mr. Roblin announced that his Government will at once enter upon the broad policy of developing the great Hinterland to Hudson's Bay.

THE FOLLOWING WAS INADVERTENTLY OMITTED FROM YESTERDAY'S ISSUE.

CHICAGO, Ill., Nov. 19—The propriety of a bill to legalize same-sex marriages in Illinois, through a decision in the Appellate Court of Southern Illinois.

The remarriage of divorce persons within a year, even though the ceremony is performed in another state, is declared illegal. The principals in such marriages are declared guilty of a criminal offence and liable to criminal prosecution, should they return to Illinois to live, following their second venture in matrimony.

The case that brought about this decision was that of John Nehring against Frances Nehring. Mrs. Nehring was divorced from her first husband last June. Two months later she accompanied Mr. Nehring to Wisconsin, where they were married. Then they returned to Mount Vernon to live.

Later Nehring sued for divorce, setting forth that his marriage was a violation of the Illinois law, and should be set aside. After a mass of law had been cited on both sides, the court upheld his contention.

The immediate result of this decision, say Chicago lawyers, will be that every man or woman married under these circumstances will be compelled to be remarried at once, or live with the doubt of the legality of their marriage hanging over them.

Children born of such marriages would occupy the same positions in court as those born out of wedlock, the lawyers assert. They would have no standing before the law.

This decision is considered of great importance, because it is completely at variance with that of Judge Willard McEwen, who in 1907 held that such marriages are legal. Thousands of divorced persons have taken this decision as final.

NEW YORK, Nov. 20—A young woman naming her own sister in her divorce action, a mother testifying against her daughter, and a lawyer testifying against his father, maintained the interest yesterday of the "divorce fans," who flock to the Supreme Court's weekly divorce matinees.

Mrs. Annetta Elsemann complained to Justice Guy that her sister, Carrie Hagemeister, had won the affections of her husband, Edward R. Elsemann. In support of her contentions she asked her aged mother, Mrs. Mary Hagemeister, to take the stand.

"Yes," said Mrs. Hagemeister, "it is true that Carrie took Annetta's Edward away from her, and she kept his eyes for her. One day Edward was missing. So was Carrie. I felt terrible."

Justice Guy reserved decision.

Robert Irving Guy, fourteen years old, was called to the stand to help his mother, Mrs. Guileneau Guy, prove that she was entitled to a divorce from Robert Guy. The boy testified that he had frequently visited his father at Newark, N. J., and had remained over night. A Mrs. Brown, he said, slept in the same room.

The marriage of divorced persons a little girl, three years old, who, his father had told him, was his sister. Decision was reserved.

In the next two cases men were forced to testify against their chums. Alexander J. McConnell, a broker in Wall street, testified against his friend, Leo B. Greece. He told of a woman. Justice Guy reserved decision.

Mrs. Ethel H. Cunningham, sixteen years old, who looked more like a school girl than an aggrieved wife, asked for a divorce from Bernard Cunningham. Two relatives told of the husband's visit to a hotel.

NEW ORLEANS, November 20.—The so-called Aldrich plan of currency reform will meet with the almost unanimous endorsement of the American Banker's association. This is the opinion expressed very emphatically today by C. N. Watts, president of the association, which formally opens its 37th annual convention here tomorrow.

"There is urgent necessity of reforming the monetary system of the United States," said Mr. Watts, "and the bankers are hopeful that congress will enact remedial legislation at its approaching session."

LONDON, Nov. 19—Great Britain's twenty-second Dreadnought, the Centurion, was launched at Davenport yesterday. The most remarkable feature of the new fighting vessel is the scores of watertight compartments of which she is composed. It is believed that she will not sink even if a whole should be broken in her below the water line.

The Centurion is a sister ship to the superdreadnought King George V., which was launched a short time ago. The designs of these vessels have been carefully guarded by the admiralty, but it is known that they are of about 23,500 tons displacement and 30,000 horse power.

Their armament will consist of ten 13.5 inch guns and twenty-four 4 inch guns. The thickest armor of the Centurion will be 12 inches. She will have three torpedo tubes firing a 21 inch torpedo with range of 7,000 yards.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 21—Princess Lai, mother of the baby Emperor of China and wife of Prince Regent, has eloped with an actor, Yung Shu Lu. A number of newspapers published in China refer to the "disgrace that has come to Royal Family."

The Princess is said to have taken her fortune with her, and to be living with Yung in Mukden.

An actor and barber are classed with the lowest castes in China, and the elopement of the Princess was the greatest disgrace that could come to the Manchu Dynasty.
