At a meeting of those concerned in Port Hope on Monday, it was decided to take immediate action, and if necessary, a E Hacker, of Toronto, will be sent to England in August to represent his father, who is at present confined to his bed through the effects of a paralytic stroke. It is estimated that the amount will be \$800,000. PARTICULARS OF GEORGETOWN TRAGEDY.

Sunday afternoon the schooner William R arrived in port at Georgetown with the remains of her late skipper Captain Henry Dicks. Following are the particulars of the sad accident which was reported in The Guardian several weeks ago:—
When the schooner, which left Georgetown with Capt. Dicks, his son Horatio, Will Hutchison and others, arrived in the vicinity of Bonaventure, Labrador, there was a heavy sea running and very little wind, so much so that at one time it was feared the vessel would be lost rounding the Point. They however reached Bonaventure safely. Fish of all kinds were very plentiful, and the Captain and all hands were in the best of spirits. When through fishing Captain Dicks, Horatio and Will Hutchison struck out to visit a house on shore. The two young men relieved themselves of their coats and settled down to a three mile pull. As they approached the shore they observed the breakers and were on the lookout, but an unexpected one much further out than the others completely overturned the dory up-side down and precipitated the occupants into the water. Being excellent swimmers they at once endeavored to reach their craft but were unsuccessful. The captain, who had on heavy clothing, and Hutchison were by this time somewhat exhausted. They however, all got hold of the bottom of the dory and gradually drifted towards the heavy breakers. Horatio alone was able to successfully cling to the dory, at least half a dozen times having to strike out and bring his father and Hutchison back. This was very exhausting, so at length he took each of them by one hand, still clinging to the dory, and brought them safely through the breakers. Slowly they were approaching the shore when the dory struck a rock. The Captain was now unconscious also Hutchison. Both were unable to utter a word. Horatio was still quite vigorous. The last words spoken by the Captain were to advise the boys to strike out for themselves. Hutchison was miraculously hurled ashore unconscious, but was restored by a woman who was on the Island gathering eggs among the rocks. The last he saw of Horatio he was apparently swimming in the water holding on to something below the surface. This is the last he remembers. The supposition is that the captain was dead before they reached the shore and that Horatio was unable to release him.
It is exactly one month since the vessel set sail. On the return voyage a heavy gale was experienced which carried away the mast, log jib and wrecked the fore top stand head.
The numerous ships in port Monday were floating at half mast out of sympathy to the bereaved to whom The Guardian also extends sincere sympathy.
The funeral took place Monday afternoon at 1 o'clock from the Queen's Wharf to the Episcopal Cemetery. The pall was a SURPRISING DISCOVERY.

The casket was wrapped in the folds of the Union Jack and literally over-d with flowers.
Capt. Henry Dicks was 61 years of age and for 13 years a respected and industrious citizen of Georgetown. His loss will be greatly felt along the water front. The body of Horatio has not yet been found, but search is being made by the people of Bonaventure.

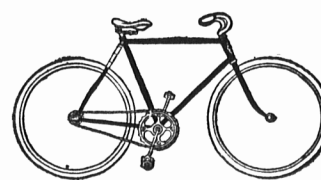
