U. S. METHODISTS PLAN SKYSCRAPER CHURCH

NEW YORK, Oct. 30.—Tentative plans have been made for the building of a skyscraper church, to be the headquarters of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the North and South Methodists consolidated. J. Fletcher Shera, trustee and treasurer of the John Street Methodist Episcopal Church, told The Mail and Empire today. The Methodist congregation sees in the future the "mother church" built in 1841 on the site of the First Methodist Church, still standing at number 44 John Street, holding the relics of the old building, and of John Wesley, founder of the denomination. Suspended over it and built around it would be the thirty-story building, headquarters for the eight million Methodists in the United States. The parts of the building not used for church purposes would be rented to outsiders supplying the church with an income.

MR. BOULTER ON POTATO MARKET

The seed potato situation was the title of a very interesting and timely address delivered by Rotarian J. Wilfrid Boulter Secretary of the Potato Growers' Association, at the weekly luncheon of the Rotary Club yesterday, with Rotarian C. H. Chandler in the chair. Mr. Boulter spoke in part as follows:—
We cannot very well speak about the seed potato industry without connecting it with the work of the P. E. I. Potato Growers' Association. I will not tire you with any explanation of the Association except to show how vital its existence is to the continuance of the seed industry. This is a testing time for such an organization, still I believe that it will weather this most terrific assault of a demoralized continental market. There is nothing encouraging to be said today. There is no market for seed potatoes at any price. Seed will be needed and seed will be purchased, but not till it is needed and when needed it will not be paid for except by dealers who will be obliged to carry their patrons hoping for better things of next season's crop. Why such conditions? Because of over production. It has been said that there were 7 or 8 thousand cars of potatoes left on the ground this year in the State of Virginia alone, 108,000 bushels, less than half of Statistics show that the Southern States shipped eighteen thousand cars in 1924 over their 1923 shipment. The effect of this surplus is being put in storage, the price is low, much below the cost of production in every country unless it be Prince Edward Island. Our province with its fertile soil can produce more than any other in the continent. The yield this year has exceeded the expectations of the most enthusiastic growers. Three hundred bushels per acre is ordinary while many claim from actual reckonings from 450 to 600 bushels per acre. Now how can any one expect to sell all this seed when there is no market. Last year we could have sold double the quantity we had. This year there is three times the acreage and almost three times the yield per acre and no demand.

It is easy to talk about the seed potato market, to be pessimistic, and to conclude with, "Oh, I knew it." I have never yet met the man who knew anything about potato markets beyond the time in which he is talking. Fortunately we have never heard our seed condemned. They want it, but cannot pay for it. No more money than our farmers and many of them not as much. They, as we, are dependent on the markets and prices and we can readily understand their unwillingness to buy an article now they know they can buy three months later at the same price. What do we learn from this? That to continue the seed potato industry we must have frost proof storage houses. That a man is unwise to grow more potatoes than he can properly protect from frost. This warning was given by the Association at the time and time again, but never heeded. This year's experience fore-

es the truth home and it is doubtful if such ever happens again. We can ship more cheaply by water than by rail, therefore we should try to arrange for late shipments preferably from Georgetown. This year we are just coaxing them to buy. They know it. In fact the information has been sent to our principal buyers from parties in the province evidently for the purpose of injuring sales. They have been told we have a large crop, no storage, and that seed potatoes can be bought for a very low figure. In conclusion let me tell you what we have done to date. We have shipped 50,000 bushels certified seed. We have 50,000 bushels assembled in Charlottetown ready to load a second teamer Friday or Saturday. We have another 50,000 bushels sold to be loaded next week providing the order is not cancelled before the steamer arrives, a total of 150,000 bushels sold for fall delivery apart from about 20 cars by over production. It has been said that there were 7 or 8 thousand cars of potatoes left on the ground this year in the State of Virginia alone, 108,000 bushels, less than half of Statistics show that the Southern States shipped eighteen thousand cars in 1924 over their 1923 shipment.
