URGES GOVERNMENT TO RECONSIDER

LONDON, Aug. 8 (Special).—The Morning Post, in an editorial in which it takes the ground that the financial consideration involved in relatively small, urges the government to consider its decision not participate in the Panama-Pacific Exposition.

The editorial says it will be difficult, in amity, to refuse Secretary of State Bryan's request for such reconsideration, unless the reasons for the refusal to participate are absolutely invincible, and that it is possible a modification of the government's attitude might provoke corresponding modifications in the attitude of British manufacturers and traders.
