Convention

SUNDAY SCHOOL CONVENTION FOR YORK DISTRICT

The annual Sunday School convention for the York district met in York Church Thursday afternoon, Oct. 6 with Mrs. Wm. Clark in charge of devotional period. Meeting opened by singing hymn "All People That on Earth do dwell" followed by Scripture lesson taken from Psalm one hundred and one hundred and seven, also first chapter of Luke's Gospel beginning at the sixty-eighth verse. Then followed a short address on "Thankfulness that world war was averted," which was heartily enjoyed by all. After singing another hymn "Breathe on Me Breath of God," Rev. Mr. Nicholson led in prayer. The President, Mr. Harold Vesey opened the business part of the meeting by calling on the Secretary Leonard Cudmore to read the minutes of last Sunday School Convention. Minutes were on motion adopted. The financial statement was also read and accepted. The President then introduced the speaker Rev. Mr. Gibson, who explained in his address that the purpose of the M. R. E. C. was to promote Christian Education.

A roll call of the schools of the district showed representatives present from the following schools, South Winsloes, North Winsloes, Union Road, West Covehead, York, Brackley, Highfield, Princetown, Ebenezer and Covehead. The following were appointed as a Nominating Committee, Mrs. Ambrose Mallett, Mrs. Wm. Clark, and Miss Ruth Cudmore. After the singing of a hymn, "Jesus the very Thought of Thee," Rev. Mr. Gibson led the convention in a discussion concerning "How can we increase the attendance of the Sunday School?" He recommended personal visitation. He also suggested that the teachers and officers get together once a month to discuss Sunday School problems. And also stressed the value of equal standing of Christianity in the community. After the singing of a hymn, "More Love to Thee O Christ," the meeting was brought to a close with a short prayer and Benediction by Rev. Mr. Skinner. The evening session of the meeting which was well attended opened with the President, Mr. Harold Vesey in the chair. Hymn, "O Worship the King" was sung and Rev. Mr. Nicholson led in prayer. After the rendering of a selection by the choir, the President read the second chapter of Luke beginning at the forty-second verse, followed by singing hymn "Jesus Calls Us O'er the Tumult."

Following are the officers appointed for the ensuing year: Pres. Mr. Harold Vesey; Vice Presid. Mr. B. C. Hardy; Secretary-treasurer, Miss Erma Mallett. A vote of thanks was given to the people of York for the use of their church and splendid hospitality. A report from the M. R. E. C. Convention held at Kentville last year was read by Miss Erma Mallett which was very interesting. The offering was received and a beautiful selection "Blue Galilee" was rendered by the choir. The President called on Rev. Mr. Gibson to address the Convention. This Mr. Gibson did and stressed the influence of the adults' example, followed by prayer. After which the closing hymn was sung, "Lord Speak to Me that I May Speak." Rev. Mr. Nicholson moved that a vote of thanks be extended to Mrs. Wm. Clark, Miss Erma Mallett and Rev. Mr. Gibson for their part in making the convention such a success. Seconded by Rev. Mr. Skinner. Rev. Mr. Gibson then announced the Benediction.

MR. MILES I. KILLAM, HAVELOCK, PASSES

HAVELOCK Nov. 2—The death of Miles I. Killam occurred here Friday morning after an illness of several months. Mr. Killam was 75 years old, having been born May 21, 1863, at Killam's Mills, N. B., a son of the late Allan Killam and Abigail (Keith) Killam, pioneers who established saw and grain mills from which the community got its name.

He was widely known throughout Salisbury parish and Havelock, where he had resided for the greater part of his life. He was a staunch adherent of the Methodist Church, and will be remembered by his many friends for his kind and generous nature.

He is survived by six sons, Hurd, of Montague, P. E. I.; Cecil, Georgetown, Mass.; Guy, of Killam's Mills; Allan of Lewis Mountain; Guernsey of Saint John, and Lewis of Havelock, with whom he resided; two daughters, Myrtle (Mrs. J. C. 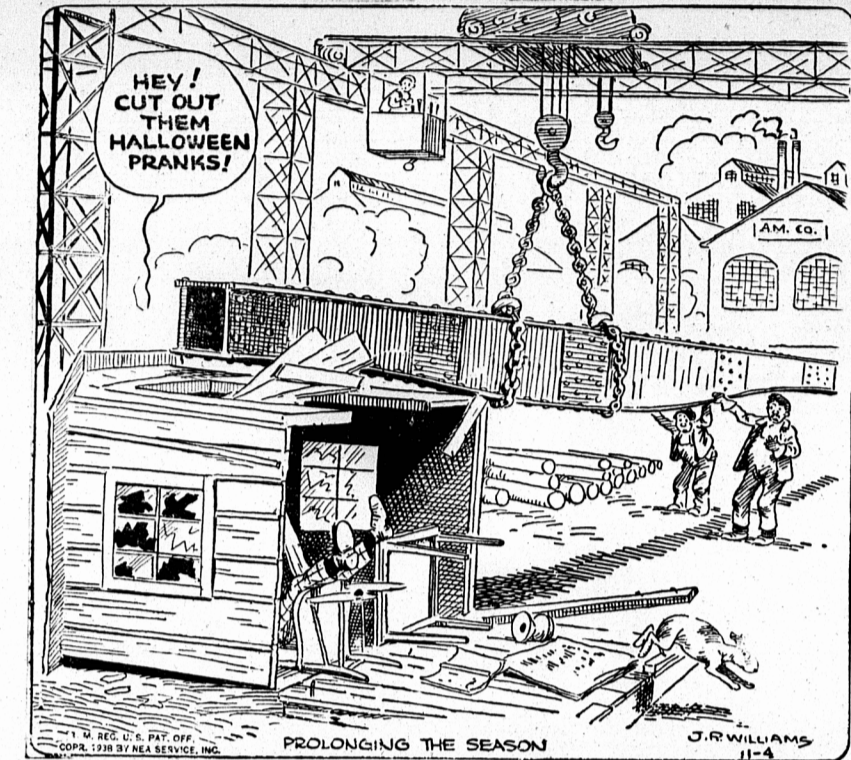

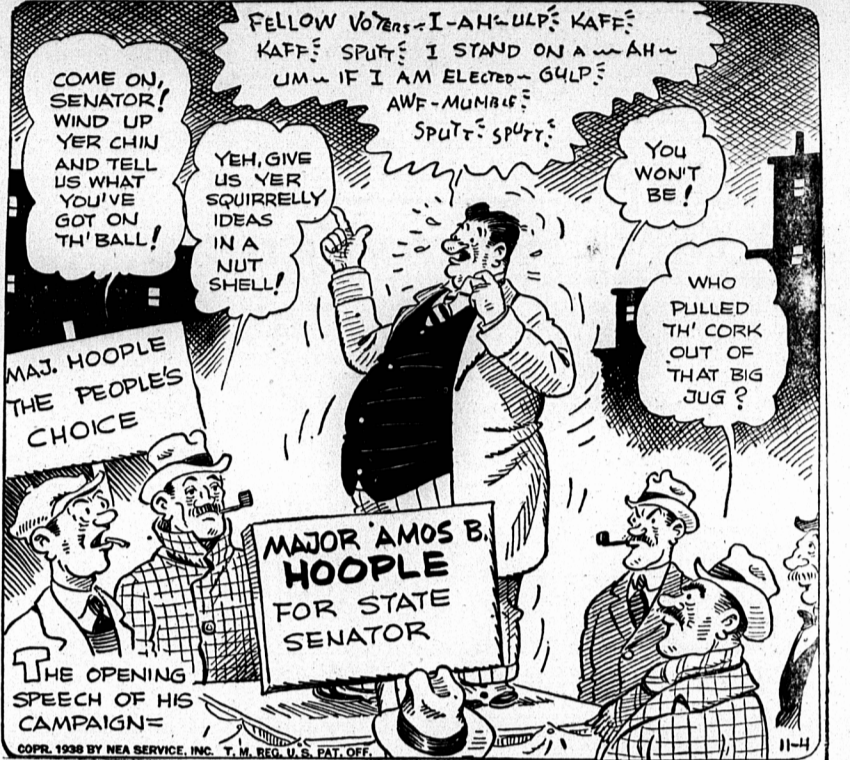
