MONTREAL, Feb. 11—(CP)—Produce prices quoted here today were reported by the Dominion Department of Agriculture as follows:

Butter: Wholesale Que pasteurized, fresh and storage no. 1, 61 3-4. Current receipts Que no. 1 pasteurized, 67; no. 2, 66. Firm grade cream print job price 53—59 1-4, solids 68—68 1-4.
Cheese: Current receipts western white 35 7-8. (Fob factory shipping points) wholesale: Western white and colored 36—36 1-2. No other prices established.
Potatoes: Que no 1 75 lbs. 2.00—2.10; NB no 1 75 lbs 2.15—2.25; PEB no 1 2.25—2.35; no 2 2.00—2.10.

Livestock

MONTREAL, Feb. 11—(CP)—Prices on all classes of livestock were firm on the two Montreal livestock markets today. Receipts: 43 cattle, 54 calves, 11 sheep and lambs, 113 hogs.
There were no early sales in cattle despite a new arrival of two carloads of western cattle.
Calves were in very good demand. Veals ranged from 18-24 according to quality. Grass calves made the bulk of the offerings and were sold at 13.
Buck lambs brought 16. Sheep were 5-9.
Hogs were selling at 25.50-28.75 for grade A. Sows were 19-20 dressed.
Maritimes livestock market report follows:
Moncton hogs grade A sold at 28.50. B-1, 28.10, sows number one 18 hot dressed weight delivered. Charlottetown hogs grade A were 27.50. B-1, 27.10 fob country points.
Choice steers and heifers brought 15, good 14.
There were no lambs quotations. Sheep were 15 grade A.

Dr. Found Speaks On Communicable Diseases

Latest methods in the control of certain communicable diseases formed the subject of an interesting address by Dr. E. M. Found, of the staff of the Provincial Sanatorium, at the regular meeting of the Hi-Y Grads. Excerpts from Dr. Found's remarks follow:
"The interest of your very active club in matters pertaining to the comforts of the sick, has been an inspiration to those of us who are daily dealing with the afflictions of mankind. Co-operation and understanding between public health workers and voluntary organizations are invaluable adjuncts in the control of disease among the people of this City and among the general population of Prince Edward Island."
"In spite of reluctantly accepting the invitation to address you tonight, it gives me the opportunity to personally express my sincere appreciation to this Club for your generosity to the Sanatorium in March 1945 your club donated the sum of \$250. In April 1947 your club again donated \$325. These monies have been used to purchase furniture and radio equipment which have added greatly to the patients' comfort and entertainment."
"I would like to review with you tonight a group of communicable diseases which can be prevented or controlled."
"The first disease we will discuss is diphtheria."
"Each year diphtheria causes more deaths among children in Canada than any other disease found among this age group. It is caused by the Klebs-Loeffler bacillus. The clinical characteristics of diphtheria are the formation of a whitish-grey membrane upon the tonsils or back of the nose and throat, from which is absorbed toxins or poisons which attack heart muscle and nerve tissue. No doubt many of you have seen the sad aftermath of diphtheria, that of a young semi-invalid with a heart condition. You before me here tonight by a timely warning to others, or in the case of your own children can prevent this awful malady, and this is what should be done."
Danger Of Neglect
"At the age of six months, three inoculations of diphtheria toxoid is administered. A re-inforcing dose of toxoid should be given each succeeding 3 to 4 years. Parents or guardians who having been told that it is possible to have their children absolutely protected against diphtheria, and who fail to do so are betraying a sacred trust and will be morally responsible should any of their children suffer from the complications or die from the disease."
"Whooping cough or pertussis. You are all familiar with and have seen children or young adults with whooping cough. This disease is the greatest killer of children under two years of age. The complications of whooping cough are more serious and dangerous than the disease itself. What are the complications?
"The lungs may be affected in the following ways: (a) Bronchopneumonia, (b) Lobar pneumonia, (c) Tuberculosis in later years. (d) Chronic Bronchitis in later years. (e) Bronchiectasis, (f) Lung abscess."
"The kidneys may be affected, leading to nephritis. The nerves may be affected, leading to convulsions, the ears, leading to otitis media and deafness, excessive convulsive coughing may cause a hernia or rupture."
"Whooping cough can be prevented in 90 per cent of cases by inoculation with Pertussis vaccine. Whooping cough must not be regarded with complacency. Even if parents are convinced that "some day" their child is bound to have this disease, that "evil day" should be postponed as long as possible, since the older the child when the disease is contracted, the less serious the disease and its complications."
"The organism causing lockjaw is called the Tetanus bacillus, and is

always present in the soil, particularly in gardens or on the road, or wherever manure may be present.
"This disease is a dreadful one, in that it attacks the nervous system in such a way that progressive paralysis and spasms of all the muscles of the jaw are affected, so that the unfortunate victim cannot open his mouth hence the name lockjaw. Consciousness remains till death. Protection is very similar to that of diphtheria, i.e. tetanus toxoid is used."
"Dr. B. C. Keeping informs me that about May 1948, a campaign will be launched by the Department of Health and Welfare of this Province to give all pre-school children combined diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus inoculations. At this point, I would like to warn you that anyone, not already immunized against tetanus, who receives an injury, such as that received when stepping on a rusty nail that has been lying on the ground; or receive a cut in an automobile accident on the highway should immediately following first aid treatment, go to his doctor and demand a prophylactic dose of anti-tetanus serum."
Smallpox
"Smallpox is another dreadful acute infectious and contagious disease which is not infrequently fatal."
"Smallpox is still prevalent in United States and to a lesser degree in Canada. In these days of rapid travel from one section of the world to another, it is of paramount importance to maintain protection against the horrible disease by Vaccination. School children are required to be vaccinated for attendance at school; infants over nine months of age should be vaccinated and re-vaccinated every six to nine years."
Tuberculosis
"During the past three to five years, the general trend toward tuberculosis has been more or less that of complacency. Most of this complacency can be laid to the fact that many discussions of public health by lay writers as well as by some physicians have been trained upon heart ailments, cancer, venereal diseases, etc., also upon so-called "wonder drugs" which are supposed to cure tuberculosis."
"It is perfectly true that almost unbelievable things have been accomplished in the control of this disease."
Still Greatest Killer
"In the year 1900, two hundred out of every 100,000 Canadians who died were victims of tuberculosis. In 1946, only 47.2 out of every 100,000, a decrease of about 50 per cent. It is also true that tuberculosis has dropped from
