The following named annual bedding flowers, by mail at 18c. per doz.—at the Charlottetown market, 15c. per doz: Asters, petunia, phlox, verbena, zinnia, chrysanthemum, candytuft, lobelia, salpiglossis, portulaca double, mignonettes, alyssum (carpet of snow) golden feather, everlasting, snapdragon, French Legion of Honor marigold, larkspur, nasturtium (tall and dwarf), gaillardia, etc.

The following varieties by mail at 23c. per doz.—market, 20c: Seeding pansy and daisy, seeding dahlia double and single, Cosmos, seedling Marguerite carnations, double stocks, kochia Mexican fire bush; also alyssum and golden feather per 100, 75c. Perennials wintered over (large proportion winter killed) pansy and daisy in bloom, carnation, hollyhock, sweet williams, forget-me-not, dianthus, 75 cents per doz. by mail—at market 60 cents.

LATEST FROM THEATRES

ELIZABETH BRICE AND CHARLES KING AT B. F. KEITH'S THEATRE.

Elizabeth Brice and Charles J. 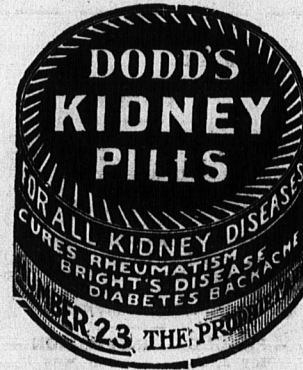

THE ALLIES MUST HAVE MORE SHELLS

LONDON, June 22.—David Lloyd George, minister of munitions, who has returned from a week-end visit to Boulogne, where he consulted Albert Thomas, French under-secretary of war on the munitions question, is forming committees in London as well as in all manufacturing towns to take advantage of every possibility for increasing the production of munitions, which is the gravest problem confronting the allies in all theatres of war.

The Times this morning prints a despatch from its correspondent in eastern France, who asserts that if the French troops are to drive home their offensive in overwhelming force, they must use a tremendously increased bulk of ammunition. The same lesson comes from England from the Woevre front, he points out, while the retreat of the Russian armies in Galicia hammers it home again. The correspondent says that the daily output of shells certainly is much larger than it was four months ago, and that it is possible that a reserve of ammunition is being built up much more rapidly than is apparent at the front, but he adds, "What we have come to is the redemption of the world by shells."
