EMIGRATION HURTS IRELAND

Loss Of Young And Strong Sapping The Country's Life.

LONDON, June 8.—The Royal Commission on the Emigration in Ireland has finished its labors and has issued its final report. According to the Rev. Archdeacon David the population in Kerry was 203,800 in 1841 and only 166,720 last year. The decrease is due to emigration to America, which, Archdeacon David describes as a great evil, because it is not the weak and infirm who leave the country but the young and strong, upon whom the nation should depend for growth and progress. Last year 1,771 people emigrated from the country between the ages of fifteen and thirty. The Archdeacon thinks that great efforts should be made to keep the youth in the country. The only remedy seemed to be the growth of Irish industries, and that would take time. The witness, John Downing, stated that eighty per cent. of the holdings on Lord Lansdowne's estate was uneconomic. The people could not maintain themselves were it not for fishing and the money sent by friends in America. There was no means of enlarging the holdings, as Lord Lansdowne had planted all lands that fell into his hands through right of pre-emption. The only remedy would be to grant the estate to commissioners, with compulsory powers of acquisition.

SIR ROBERT HART AND THE CHINESE

Will Know How To Temper Their Strength With Wisdom.

LONDON, June 8.—The Daily Mail's correspondent at Genoa telegraphs an interview he had with Sir Robert Hart, Director General of Chinese Customs who arrived there yesterday on board the German liner Yorokka bound for England. Concerning China's future, Sir Robert said he was a great believer in the Chinese. Once they were organized after the European plan he declared they certainly were destined to become a powerful nation, but with such an immense mass the work must go slowly, and by the time a long modern line even if they are aggressive, which they are not now they will know how to temper their strength with wisdom.

ANOTHER CASE OF "UNWRITTEN LAW"

Justification Claimed For Sooting Of Dr. Anspitz By Nurse Koten.

NEW YORK, June 9.—Sarah Koten, the young trained nurse who enticed Dr. Martin W. Anspitz to a house in Harlem last night with a false sick call by telephone and shot him to death after she had lain in wait for hours, declared today that she had no regret for her act. "I shot him but I did not murder him," she said. "I killed him because he had wronged me and then refused to help me. I tried to punish him in the courts but found myself powerless. My father and mother are dead, so I had to protect my honor myself. There seems little doubt that when the case against the girl goes to trial the jury will once more have an opportunity to pass upon the 'unwritten law,' or the justification of murder under certain circumstances. Sarah Koten presented a most dejected appearance when she was arraigned. She sobbed incessantly. She was remanded to the coroner who will hold an inquest.

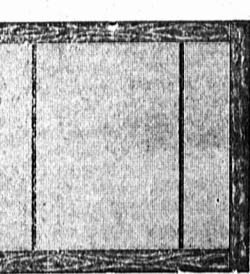
