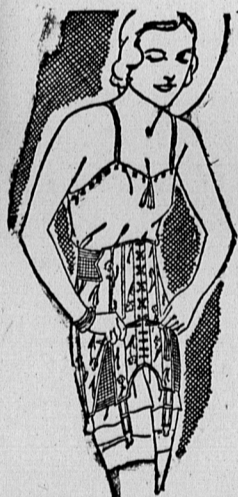

#### MOTHER CONFINES CHILD NIGHTLY IN HOME MADE STRAIT JACKET

SIDNEY, S. Australia, Oct. 4.—Under the delusion that some harm was going to befall her child, a mother living in a Sydney lodging house used to sew her little daughter into a terrible strait jacket every night.

This was the discovery made by the police when they entered the lodging house one night and found the golden haired little girl, confined in this cramping contraption sleeping beside her mother. The child, who is seven years old, had been undergoing this ordeal every night for 18 months.

The suit into which she was sewn at nights was made of very thin oilcloth, odds and ends of woollen jumpers and sacking, cardboard, kapok and other packing. The contrivance was so tight that the child could not move and the policemen had to use very sharp knives to cut the child free. It is considered a marvel that the child was not driven insane by the contraption, which even held the feet straight down from the ankle.

The mother is to be brought before the Lunacy Court.

#### 'DESCENDANT' CLAIMS KING TUT'S TREASURES

ALEXANDRIA, Egypt, Oct. 4.—A man, claiming to be a direct descendant of King Tut-Ankh-Amen, announced yesterday that he is going to embark upon a "fast unto death."

He claims that his ancestor's treasures are held by the Government when he should have them. He will proceed to the temple at Edfu on Oct. 11, he said, having selected that date to start his hunger strike because it is the date of King Tut's death 30 centuries ago. "Under the shadow of the God Horus," he said, "I will starve myself to death unless the Government hands over my treasures."

#### International Passenger Traffic

There was an increase in passenger traffic across the international boundary between Canada and the United States in 1931 compared with 1930, according to reports of international bridge, ferry, and tunnel companies made to the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. Railways and lake boats also reported an increase in international travel.

Bridge, ferry and tunnel traffic in 1931 consisted of 7,597,983 motor vehicles, 213 horse drawn vehicles and 26,128,757 pedestrians and passengers, exclusive of drivers of vehicles. This tally counts one

round trip as two trips. Including drivers, the total number of persons crossing the border on ferries, bridges and through tunnels was 33,726,740, compared with 31,697,976 in 1930.

Motorists crossing on highways in 1931 numbered 8,537,474 as against 10,650,200 in 1930, railway passengers exclusive of through passengers 2,539,616 compared with 1,872,500 and boat passengers other than ferry 508,500 as compared with 500,060. Total crossings, therefore, were 45,312,310 as compared with 44,420,736 in 1930.
