Anglo-French Agreement Re Reparation

HYTHE, Eng., May 17.—Premier Lloyd George and Premier Millerand and their advisers conferred here this morning, the meeting lasting until nearly one o'clock. After the conference Millerand and suite left for home. An official statement issued at the close of the conference said the British and French Governments recognized on one hand that it is to the general interest that reparation for loss and damages caused by the war should be secured as soon as possible. With this object in view it is necessary the resources be made effectively available without delay and on the other hand that it is desirable that Germany be put in a position to regain financial autonomy by speedy fulfillment of her obligations.

Canonization of Joan of Arc Imposing Ceremony

ROME, May 17th.—The Canonization of Joan of Arc, French National Heroine, was celebrated by Pope Benedict this morning in St. Peter's. It was the greatest and most impressive function performed in the historic basilica for several centuries past.

PARIS, May 17.—All churches in Paris from the historic Notre Dame to the most humble chapel in the suburbs celebrated the canonization of Joan of Arc today.

LONDON, May 17.—The whole Catholic world was represented at the remarkable scenes of devotion in the celebration today of the canonization of Joan of Arc at Westminster Cathedral. The thousands thronging the cathedral included visitors from China, India, Russia and other distant parts.

Russia Hard Pressed By The Poles

LONDON, May 17.—A Russian Government wireless communication from Moscow, dated 16th and the first despatch received here for several days was picked today reporting fighting on the Polish front of a fierce character. It said entire villages were being destroyed by fire and large quantities of grain burned. The despatch also gave the text of an appeal made to Russian citizens and to the proletariat of all countries denouncing the Polish attack and urging that nothing be done to aid shipping or sending arms and ammunition to the Poles, or taking any action that might assist the Polish attack.

A Good Reserve For Note Issue

OTTAWA, May 17.—The Dominion of Canada notes in circulation total \$309,142,651 against which there is held in gold the sum of \$101,636,652, or approximately 32 per cent. In addition to gold, however, there is held \$154,862,225 in approved securities. Taking gold and securities together the note circulation is backed to the extent of approximately 82 per cent.

A Night of Terror In Londonderry

BELFAST, May 17.—Londonderry experienced a night of terror on Saturday, part of the city being for hours at the mercy of a riotous mob. During the disturbances Sergeant Dennis Moroney, chief of the special criminal department of the city was shot through the right lung and died within half an hour. Londonderry thus gains the unenviable reputation of being the scene of the first police murder in Ulster since the opening of the assassination campaign on January 1st.
