Brig. Foster New Canadian Minister to Japan?

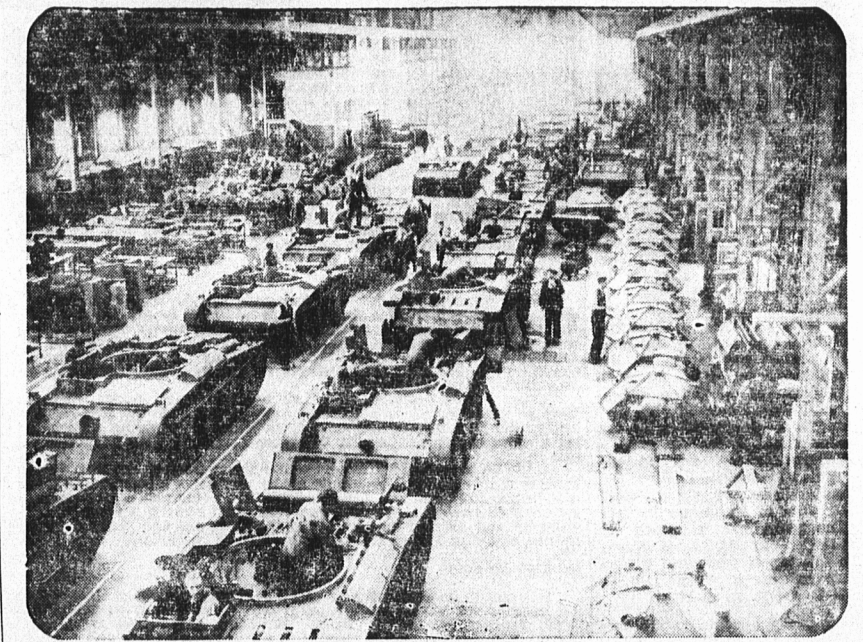

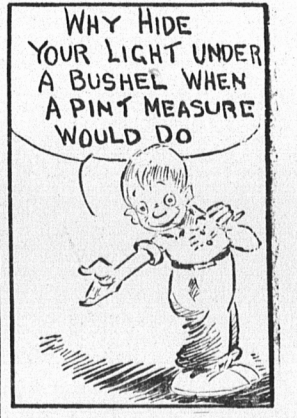
