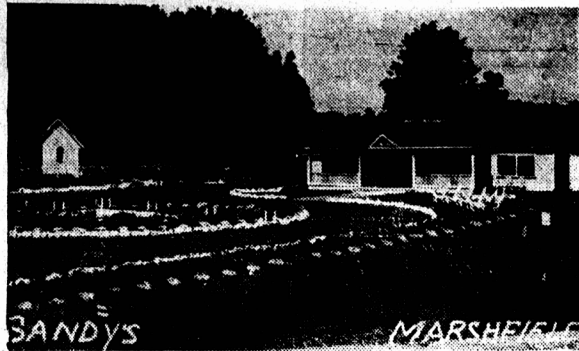

and there South's chance vanished! If he took the finesse. East would win and then get his club ruff; if he did not take the finesse, West would soon gain the lead with the spade ace, cash his second club trick, give East the club ruff, and then East could lay down the diamond king for the setting trick. It is easy to see that if West had continued with clubs, successful defense would have been impossible. After ruffing the third club, East could make no ruff on diamonds from his side and South could knock out the spade ace and discard his own diamond loser on the heart jack. West's heart queen having fallen.

Contract Bridge

CORRECT "DISOBEDIENCE"

There are times when a defender should over-rule his partner's signals. For example:

South dealer		East-West vulnerable	
North-South part-score 30.			
♠ J 8	♥ K J 7 4 3	♠ 9 5 4	♥ 10 8 6 3
♦ A Q 4	♣ 3 2	♦ K J 8 3	♣ 9 4
♠ K Q 10 7 3 2	♥ A 9	♦ 6 5	♣ Q J 10

The bidding:
South West North East
1♠ 2♣ 2♥ 2♠
2♦ Pass 3♦ Pass

Considering North-South's 30 score, North's raise to three spades was probably the best call available.

West opened the club king, and East started to "echo" by playing the nine. With no knowledge of the spade or heart situation, this was not entirely illogical on East's part, because he naturally wanted to ruff the third round of clubs. West, however, thought things over. Suppose East did ruff the third round of clubs? That would be only three tricks for the defense, and West's spade ace would be only the fourth. Thus, East would have to have either the heart ace or the diamond king to defeat the contract.

It was extremely improbable, on the bidding, that East could have the heart ace, but he might have the diamond king. So West shifted to a diamond—and right then
