Sir Edward Kemp Arrives

(Special to The Guardian) HALIFAX, May 9.—"For the purpose of giving to the people of Canada facts regarding the condition of the war and the handling of their troops overseas," Sir Edward Kemp, Overseas Minister of Militia arrived here today from England on the Mauretania and left for Ottawa on the afternoon train. "I don't know of any charges that have been made against the overseas administration," he told a reporter "as far as I am concerned I will take my seat in the House and present the whole case to the people. I have the absolute facts and the people will get them." A tribute to Lieut.-Col. Charles Bent and his quarter staff of the 15th Highlanders was written in the form of a poem by Major-General Robert Baden-Powell who crossed the Atlantic with the 15th Battalion.

Mauretania Arrives

(Special to The Guardian) HALIFAX, May 9.—The Cunard liner Mauretania docked at Halifax today with 4,000 returning Canadian soldiers made up of number one, two, and three brigades of artillery siege batteries, one of twelve under command of General Andrew McNaughton, D. S. O., and few other details. Among the 91 civilian passengers were Sir Charles Ross, Sir Percy and Lady Daniels and Mrs. Whitelaw Reid.

Czech Forces Enter Austria

(Special to The Guardian) COPENHAGEN, May 9.—On Thursday, May 8 superior Czech forces, after a bitter struggle, have gained a footing in the town of Nagzecheny, the Hungarian supreme army command announces, says a message from Budapest today.

PARIS, May 9.—The German delegates to the peace congress are considerably divided among themselves in their views on the peace terms submitted by the Allied and associate powers it was intimated today by a high British authority.

List of Unemployed Is Growing Daily

(Special to The Guardian.) LONDON, May 9.—Well over one million people in England are receiving the government donation for unemployment and the number will be increased by the stoppage of Lancashire mills, spinning American cotton. Over 100,000 operatives have been added to the list of unemployed, while figures covering the entire country represent serious industrial situation as bad or worse than the periods of trade depression before the war. The statistical returns which have been published each week present Lancashire and Cheshire as the most seriously affected area of the country, with an unemployment rate of 398 per 10,000 of the population, as compared with a rate of 246 per 10,000 for the country as a whole.

Casualties in Egypt

(Special to The Guardian) LONDON, May 9.—The situation in Egypt is now outwardly quiet, the total military casualties during the past two months were, five British killed and six wounded. Other ranks, 18 killed and 50 wounded; Indian troops, six killed and 25 wounded. The casualties among the rioters are estimated at under one thousand including predatory Bedouins.

China Dissents

(Special to The Guardian) PARIS, May 9.—The Chinese delegation has received cabled instructions from Peking not to sign the treaty of peace because of the Kiao Chau Shantung settlement.

Vancouver—5th Battery, 5 officers, 124 other ranks. Kingston—2nd Heavy Battery, 7 officers, 130 other ranks. Victoria—12th Battery, 3 officers, 70 other ranks.

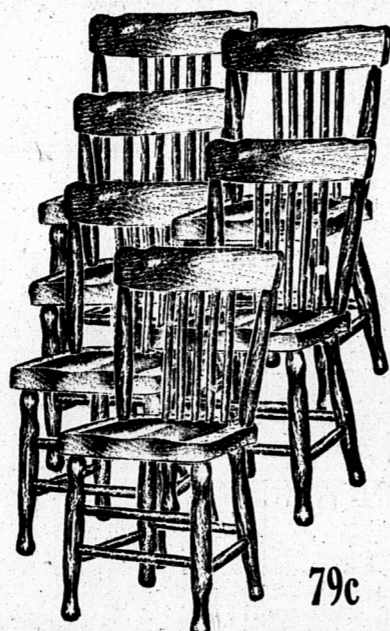

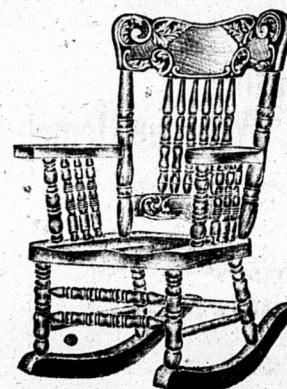

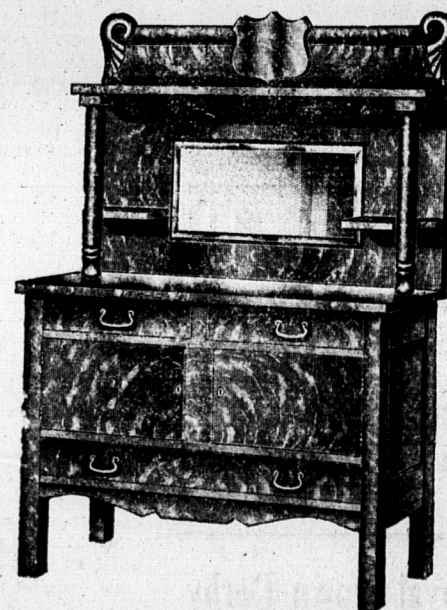
