## SPY CONFESSES HIS MISSION TO ENGLAND

Ordered to Impersonate American and Keep Track of British Fleet.

LONDON, Nov. 4.—Karl Hans Lody, alias Charles A. Ingalls, charged with espionage and on trial for his life before a courtmartial under the presidency of Lord Chylesmore, entered the witness box in the Middlesex Guildhall Saturday afternoon as soon as the prosecution had closed its case. Lody gave an outline of his mission to England. He said that formerly he was a senior lieutenant in the German navy, but later he was transferred to the reserve. He obtained an appointment as tourist agent for the Hamburg-American Line. Incidentally, he said, he was well known in New York society. When in Berlin last July, Lody said, he received instructions from a superior naval officer, whose name he was pledged not to reveal. His instructions were to select a route to New York. He was not to start for America, but was to remain in England until the first naval encounter was fought between Germany and England, and give information regarding the actual losses to the British fleet. He was then to proceed to New York.

Lody said also that he had been instructed to keep track of the movements of the British fleet. He had been warned not to do any spying. Replying to counsel, he admitted that such instructions caused him uneasiness, but he was assured that he was sufficiently American in appearance to disarm suspicion.

Lody remarked in the course of his recital that he had married two years ago an American woman of German descent. This matrimonial venture, however, was a failure, and the marriage was dissolved, his father-in-law paying \$10,000 "to compensate me for my financial losses." The prisoner explained that he told the man who gave him his instructions in Berlin that he could not travel without the necessary documents. This official had replied that he must travel as an American; and Lody added, "in consequence of that I received an American passport."

testifying, said that it was his intention when he married to become an American citizen. He claimed membership in several New York societies, such as the Japan, Peace and Philippine societies. Last summer he served on Emperor William's yacht, the Meteor.

Cwing to the character of the evidence given, the public was excluded from the court room. The trial was adjourned until Monday.

There was a sensational incident in the course of Lody's examination. A man who throughout the trial had occupied a seat on one of the War Office benches, and who was supposed to be connected with this branch of the Government, was suddenly pounced upon by detectives and removed from the building under a military escort.

## FIRING WITH ONE LEG.

The heroic and gallant conduct of Captain E. K. Bradbury, R. H. A., killed while serving a gun, has been recorded in a letter received by William Montgomery, Killoe, Mitchellstown, from one of Captain Bradbury's brother officers:

"The battery Captain Bradbury was in was surprised by a German battery in a midst early one morning, and poor old Brad was killed. Brad served a gun himself, and during that time knocked out one German gun completely; he first had a hip and one leg shot away, and still managed to fire off a round or two more, until the other leg was taken off from just above the knee. The doctor who told me about it afterwards said that all he asked was for heaps of morphine so that the men should not hear him screaming, and that he might be taken quickly to the rear. The whole story is that Brad died as one felt he would do so. Our artillery and some infantry inflicted tremendous losses on the Germans, and we captured eight guns."
