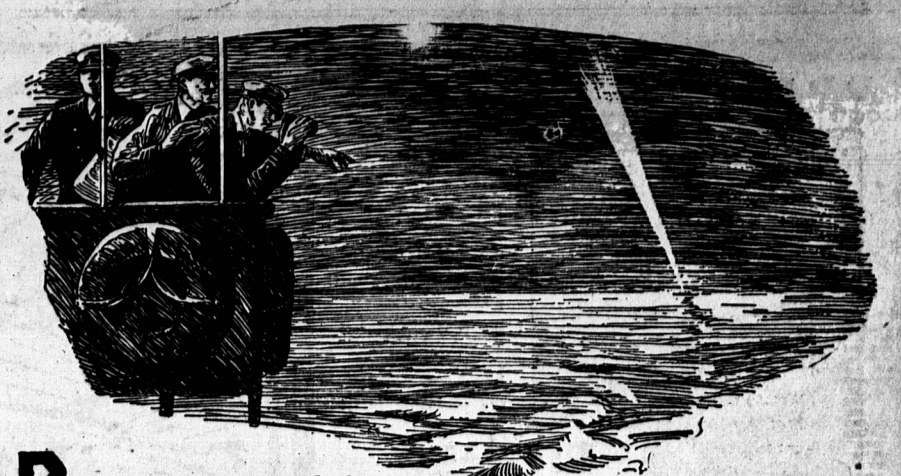

Built to go 105 Miles per hour Betty Carstairs' new motor boat, built in Silvia Yard East Coves, England, was landed from the Red Star liner Arabie on Saturday, the Halifax Shipyards crane, Lord Kitchener, removing the boat from the forward deck of the steamer and placing it on a flat car at Pier 23, whence she will be rushed to the Ditchburn Boats, Gravenhurst, Muskoka, Ont. There the boat will be tuned up and her trials will be held, after which the boat will be taken to Detroit to race on the Detroit River for the motor boat title.

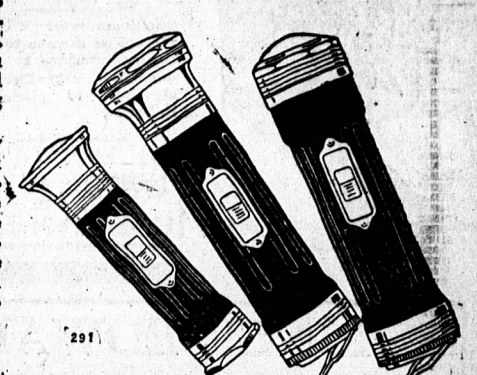
