NEW YORK, Jan. 16—(AP)—The stock market generally turned downward today as many bidders withdrew to neutral territory as a week-end precaution against international uncertainties.

Canadian stocks were easy. Distillers Seagram pfd shares declined two points to 73.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks finished with a net decline of 4 of a point at 37.9.

Among bellwethers, Du Pont fell 3-4 to a new 1941-42 bottom. Lesser losers included Allied Chemical, Union Carbide, Eastman Kodak, Dow Chemical, U.S. Gypsum, U.S. Steel, Bethlehem, Douglas Aircraft, Westinghouse, American Telephone, Union Pacific, Western Union, Standard Oil (N.J.) and Texas Co.

Only a trade in arrears were General Motors, Chrysler, Santa Fe, Anaconda, Montgomery Ward, N.Y. Central and Consolidated Edison.
