Found Highways Poor In Canada

The poor condition of highways all across Canada, as compared with those in the United States was commented upon by a Canadian representative yesterday by Mr. H. J. Wyatt, of St. John's, Newfoundland, formerly of this Province and a cousin of the late Judge Wyatt of Summerside.

Mr. Wyatt has travelled 13,558 miles in his own car since leaving St. John's on May 1, when he drove to California to attend the Rotary International convention at San Francisco last June. On return he drove to British Columbia and Alberta, with the intention of completing his trip home by way of the main highway and a road leading to the Beach Grove Inn.

Increase Shown In Late Blight

Late blight of potatoes has shown an increase in the Province during the past few days, reports Mr. R. R. Hurst, of the Dominion Laboratory of Plant Pathology. The outbreaks originating in cut piles have spread further into adjoining fields and the disease is thus well established. Present weather conditions are favorable to its spread.

For this reason, it is emphasized spray schedules materials should be followed without interruption.

Highlights Of Attlee's Plan

(Canadian Press) Highlights of the steps announced in London Wednesday by Prime Minister Attlee to counter Britain's economic crisis: Food imports from the dollar area cut by \$12,000,000 (\$45,000,000) monthly.

Limited direction of labor imposed. Twenty-per-cent increase in home agricultural production within four years.

Coal miners asked to work an extra half-hour daily. Government to do "everything in its power" to maintain basic food rations; if cuts made heavy manual workers to get preference.

Armies overseas to be reduced by 40 per cent. Gasoline ration for private motorists cut by one-third to allow only 180 miles motoring monthly. Emphasis on exports intensified with goal of 140 per cent of pre-war by middle of 1948. 170 per cent by end of 1948.

Steel output to be boosted to annual rate of 13,500,000 tons during winter; 14,000,000 tons during 1948.

Fighter control over public and private capital investments. Timber imports cut by \$10,000,000 annually.

Luxury imports cut by \$5,000,000 annually. Foreign travel allowance reduced from \$75 annually to \$35 for 14-month period.

Film imports reduced by limiting remittances on foreign films to 25 per cent of earnings of those films.

Anglo-American talks to take place on sterling convertibility and non-discrimination clauses of United States loan agreement.

Either nephew dies, their children will divide the father's share of the estate equally with the capital held in trust to each reaches the age of 30. If there is no lawful issue the nephew's nephew will become the heirs.

The greatest part of the Bennett estate was invested in the United Kingdom, a spokesman for Barclay's Bank, executors for Lord Bennett, said. While the spokesman declined details, he revealed the late peer held some Canadian investments.

Investments referred to in the will were 10,000 shares of capital stock of the Royal Bank of Canada and 200 shares of the Canadian Cement Company which the Viscount instructed be shared equally by Coates and Herizade when the estate is allocated to them.

Lord Bennett, who died at the age of 76, left many cash legacies to close friends, charities and institutions which would be affected.

His secretary, Alice Miller, was willed a cash legacy of \$1,000 and will occupy Lord Bennett's estate at Juniper Hill, Surrey, for three months. However, Pickles did specify that "our bulk long-term contracts for staple foodstuffs from these (hard currency) areas (which embraced Canada and the United States) will not, of course, be interfered with."
