## MARCONI STATION AT GLACE BAY.

When Marconi was refused permission to place a station on the island of Newfoundland for his transatlantic system he determined to erect two stations, one at Glace Bay, Cape Breton, and the other at Cape Cod, Mass. The European station is at Poldhu, Wales. The towers of the Cape Cod station were blown down when nearly completed. Hence there is no doubt that the first real business of the transatlantic wireless system will be conducted between Wales and Cape Breton. Reliable advices state that this will now be opened within a few weeks. Marconi and his people have not been idle all these months past.

The new stations differ materially from those before in use. Instead of a single tower there are four towers forming the corners of a square of 200 feet to a side. These four towers are built of wood on a foundation of concrete and are each about 32 feet square at the bottom, 10 feet square at the top and 215 feet high. They are thoroughly braced with wire ropes extending from the top to the ground in every direction. The powerful electric plant and sending and receiving station are in one storey buildings at the base of the towers. The towers are connected together at the top by four three-inch cables. From these cables are hung 150 aerial wires slanting downward and inward toward the centre of the square. Some 75 feet lower than the tip of the towers these wires are all brought together into one cable which drops perpendicularly down to the power house below.

The aerial wires are the medium by which the Hertzian waves are given forth to the air, and also by which messages are received and conveyed to the sending and receiving station below. Many and important changes have been made in the apparatus since the beginning of the work of constructing the station at Glace Bay. The coherer, before described in these columns, has been abandoned by Marconi and he has now a receiver of much greater reliability and capacity. The new method adopted is claimed to have a capacity of several hundred words a minute, which is far in advance of anything before attempted in wireless telegraphy. Mr. Vyvyan, the engineer in charge of the station, claims that with the perfected appliances and the great power now installed at Glace Bay it would be possible to transmit messages much farther than across the Atlantic. He expresses his belief that before the year is ended it will be practicable to send and receive messages between Cape Breton and San Francisco, or even Cape Town.
