GERMANS BUILD SUBMARINE BOATS

For Russia and Openly Ship Supplies for the Russian Army

THE POPE MAKING EFFORTS FOR PEACE

At the Instance of the Kaiser—Russians Strengthening Their Flanks Against the Jap Turning Movement—

Kuropatkin Gets More Guns—No New Fighting.

RUSSIANS GETTING READY. LONDON, Oct. 8.—(Special).—There is absolutely no fresh news from the front, but the belief grows that the Russians are strengthening their left flank to meet the Japanese turning movement.

MORE RUSSIAN GUNS SENT. A large number of guns have been sent to Kuropatkin.

POPE'S EFFORTS FOR PEACE. There are reports that the Pope has been in conference with Russia at the instance of the German Emperor about making peace proposals.

GERMANS AIDING RUSSIA. KIEL, Oct. 8.—(Special).—A newspaper here declares that submarines are being built in German shipbuilding yards for Russia and that many supplies for the Russian army have been packed in the presence of the customs officials. The paper challenges contradiction of these statements.

OVER-SHADOWED ISLAND. KINGSTON, Island of St. Vincent, Oct. 6.—A peculiar phenomenon, a dust cloud, overshadowed the island October 2 for a whole day. It was accompanied by intense heat, giving the impression that the Soufriere volcano on this island was erupting. No detonations were heard. An investigation has been made by a party which ascended the mountain yesterday. They report there are no indications of an eruption.
