NOBLE TRIBUTE TO LIEUT. MCKENZIE

From Harold Whidden, a Comrade-in-Arms, in the 8th Siege Battery.

The following noble tribute to the late Lieut. Cuyler McKenzie from Gunner Whidden of the 8th Siege Battery, beautifully expresses the admirable character and life of this gallant young officer.

Antigonish, N. S., Feb. 25-19.

Dear Mr. and Mrs. McKenzie. I have not the pleasure of your acquaintance; but Cuyler, your Christian son, whom God recently summoned home, was a very dear friend of mine, and I feel that I must write you, his grief-stricken parents, in your dark hour.

It is unnecessary to say that Cuyler was an exceptionally fine young man—a living example of the life that Christ expected of His followers. His life, though short, was replete with good works, and during the time he was with the 8th Siege Battery alone, he performed more genuine Christian service than do some good men in a whole lifetime of three times his years.

You will never know just what service he rendered for his Saviour by simply being pure, trusting, loving and obeying his Master; and by the good example which he so consistently set day after day.

He was such a noble fellow that one can scarcely realize he has been called away so young. But God's ways are best, and though your hearts have been made sad, I trust you will console yourselves in the knowledge that our Heavenly Father summoned Cuyler in His own season and that he is happy in the new life—the Christian's reward.

I wish I could express myself adequately at this time, but I know that no word of mine could alleviate your suffering. God knows of your sorrow, however. He will give you strength and comfort.
