SIXTY BELIEVED DRO-NED.

CHICAGO, Nov. 11.—The shores of Lake Superior, Lake Huron and Lake Erie were strawn tonight with the wreckage of three days' gale, and snow storm which cost the lives of probably three score persons, turned bottom up in mid-lake a three hundred foot vessel with its crew, wrecked or grounded numerous other craft and caused a property loss as yet unestimated, but which will run into the millions.

The details of the storm, which literally swept from the western end of Lake Superior to the eastern shore of Lake Erie, became known only today when survivors began arriving in various ports with tales of hardships and heroic rescues seldom equalled on the lakes.

On land the storm hit hardest at Cleveland, Ohio, where 21 inches of snow fell, five persons were killed and ten others lost, and where \$2,000,000 damage was caused to property, chiefly telegraph and telephone companies, thus keeping that city out of direct communication for two days.

Five bodies washed ashore at St. Joseph, on the Canadian side of Lake Huron (four had belts marked "London").

Three bodies washed ashore on the west shore of Lake Huron.

Two bodies washed ashore opposite the position of the overturned boat.

Six members of a lightskipper drowned in Lake Erie near Buffalo, N. Y.

The escapes from death were numerous. After the storm about Friday midnight had blown away the forward part of the ship, Capt. J. W. Duddleston, of the steamer L. C. Waldo, navigated by a small, inaccurate compass, and the aid of a lantern held by self and crew to a reef where the crew on landing suffered intense cold and hunger until their rescue today.

The crew of the "Turrent" Chief, when the ship struck the rocks in Lake Superior, were forced to go ashore scantily clad. They built a hut to protect them from the blizzard.

It was impossible even to estimate the loss to vessels: wrecked or damaged by grounding. Shippers in Detroit estimated the loss in Lake Huron and the Detroit and St. Clair Rivers alone to be several hundred thousand dollars. Increase the loss by \$500,000, while the scores of smaller craft driven ashore in Lake Superior and Lake Erie will send the total much higher.

CHURCHES URGED TO HELP IN SAVING HUMAN LIVES

MONTREAL, Nov. 10.—The Canadian Pacific Railway today invaded the Churches of Montreal with an appeal for assistance to stop or at least lessen an appalling loss of life on the system in eastern Canada.

Rev. J. L. Flanagan, at the Church of the Ascension, observed that he felt it was his duty to call attention to the letter which he had received from a high official of the Canadian Pacific Railway system, deploring an increase in the list of shocking fatalities.

The cases he referred to were not the kind where people met death on level crossings or on trains, but those who were run down while walking on the tracks, and were in a sense simply trespassers on the Company's property.

The list of deaths, which was appalling to railway officials, who are to some extent used to having such matters drawn to their attention, totalled 69 in the eastern division, and 26 on another division in eastern Canada.

SAW A FLAME JUST IN TIME.

BRIDGETOWN, Nov. 10.—At the home of John Muise and wife, residing on the north mountain, and while they were quietly sitting by the kitchen fire one night recently, Muise, looking out of the window, saw a flame of light running up the side of the house.

He rushed out and discovered a bag of hay saturated with oil had been placed beside the house, and fired. It was stamped out. He went inside, but did not retire.

About an hour later he saw another flame starting up the side of an outbuilding just across the road from his own house. Muise again ran out and quietly went around in the dark to the fired building.

On the way he discovered two men walking fast from the blazing spot. He recognized them. Another bag of hay was found that had been sprinkled with oil and set on fire and placed on the top of a pile of loose wood that had been piled beside the building.

Second blaze was beaten out. Two days later Muise came to town and swore out a warrant against the two men he had seen at the outbuilding. One was arrested and brought before Stipendiary Magistrate Elias Messenger.

THE LILY BOW

Do you know how to tie a lily bow? You should experiment with some old lengths of ribbon, if you mean to make for yourself a velvet-crowned hat whose smartness will depend entirely upon the poise of its trimming. First, you take your five half-yard strands of sash ribbon and, sewing one end of each about the base of a hat's crown, draw the entire number over its apex so that they shall form a puffy appearance, which will not be pretty in the silk ribbon, but which is lovely in new velvet. Having firmly twisted the whole mass together with a bit of hat wire, run the slenderest of wires along both sides of each of the ends, and then twist them into shapes as nearly as possible resembling that of a lily. One end should be bent so that its sides open out toward the bottom, another should become a half spiral. Two should be half double and a fifth should look like abutting leaf. Don't get discouraged when they refer to first to take lily leaf shapes. Wired ribbon will stand a lot of handling and, once having acquired the knack of twisting it into lily shapes, to repeat the process with velvet will be a brief task.

THREE YEAR OLD BOY DIES FROM INJURIES.

ST. JOHN, Nov. 11.—Samuel Dritz, the three-year-old son of Louis Dritz, 34 Chapel Street, who was scalded on Sunday by falling into a tub of scalding hot water, died last evening at the General Hospital as a result of the injuries.

The little child was playing with his older brother near where his mother had placed a tub of boiling water to wash some clothes. While she was in another room, he fell backwards into the tub, and was terribly scalded about the head and shoulders. He was lifted from the tub by his brother.

It was hoped at first that the child would recover but on its removal to the hospital, its condition became rapidly worse. The body was removed last night to the home of the parents in Chapel street.

MAY SEND YOUNG CRIMINALS TO THE LUMBER WOODS.

KINGSTON, Ont., Nov. 11.—To save young criminals from the associations of Portsmouth Penitentiary, an experiment in parole is now being considered by the federal authorities and is likely to be tried this year. These young prisoners, now serving terms in the Portsmouth penitentiary or other federal penitentiaries, will be sent into lumber camps throughout the Dominion next year under the personal charge of men employed by the Canadian Reading Camp Association.

The scheme originated with G. M. MacDonnell, K. C., a member of the commission investigating conditions at the penitentiary, and is a direct result of that inquiry. The youths will be given work in the woods as axemen.

NEW YORK Y. M. C. A. RAISED NEARLY \$2,000,000 IN A DAY.

NEW YORK, Nov. 11.—At a dinner last night, attended by members of a volunteer committee of one thousand men and women, organized to raise in a fortnight by subscription a \$4,000,000 fund for the Young Men's and Young Women's Christian Associations of Greater New York, it was announced that pledges made yesterday, the first day, amounted to \$1,986,346.
