By Guardian's Special Wire) STOCKHOLM, Sweden, May 12—Prince Charles, nephew of King Gustav and brother of the late Queen Astrid of the Belgians, has become the third member of the Swedish Royal Family in recent years to renounce rights of succession to the throne for love of a woman not of royal blood. King Gustav told the Royal Council the Prince had been given permission to marry Countess Elsa Von Rosen, daughter of the court master of ceremonies. She was divorced in 1935 from M. Ago's Von Rosen. She has three children. Countess is seven years older than the Prince, and although titled, is not of royal rank.

FLAMING DEATH TRAP OF AIR VOYAGERS



Only seconds after the first hint of disaster, the Hindenburg is an inferno, its flame resisting steel ribs starkly outlined by the brilliant light of clouds of burning hydrogen as would-be rescuers stand helplessly by. About half of the 100 passengers and crew aboard were believed to have died. Pictures of the disaster were flown to New York by American Air Lines
