### A TEMPERANCE MOVEMENT.

LONDON, May 18.—A despatch from Pretoria says the minister of the various denominations and others interested in the temperance cause have commenced an agitation to secure permanent government control over the liquor traffic in the Transvaal and Orange River Colony.

### LORD KITCHENER'S BULLETINS.

NEW YORK, May 18.—The Tribune correspondent in London says: War news has almost entirely disappeared from the London press. Lord Kitchener contents himself with the briefest possible bulletins summing up the captures from day to day, and the meagre press despatches contain no details of any interest. There were several despatches yesterday indicating that a rapid backdown of the Boers forces, owing to cold and starvation and the forecasts of a speedy close of hostilities were more confident than for a long time.

### THE ALERT AT ST JOHN'S, NFLD.

ST JOHN'S, Nfld, May 18.—The British armed sloop Alert, the first vessel of the Newfoundland fisheries squadron to arrive, reached St John's yesterday afternoon, to arrange with the colonial government as to the season's operations. Two French warships assigned to similar service are now due at St. Pierre, having called at the Azores.

### TAKING THE CENSUS IN TURKEY.

There is rather an old method in vogue for the taking of the census in some of the small Turkish towns, but which is not practiced in Constantinople. When the Turk wishes to determine the number of his unspeakable brethren, the following plan is adopted: officials are sent out to the various bakeries, and the total output of bread, for a certain day, is ascertained. Two loaves are then allowed per diem for each person, and the population is thereby fairly estimated. This system appears very primitive at first; but after all, appetite is the most dependable feature of some people.—King's Own.

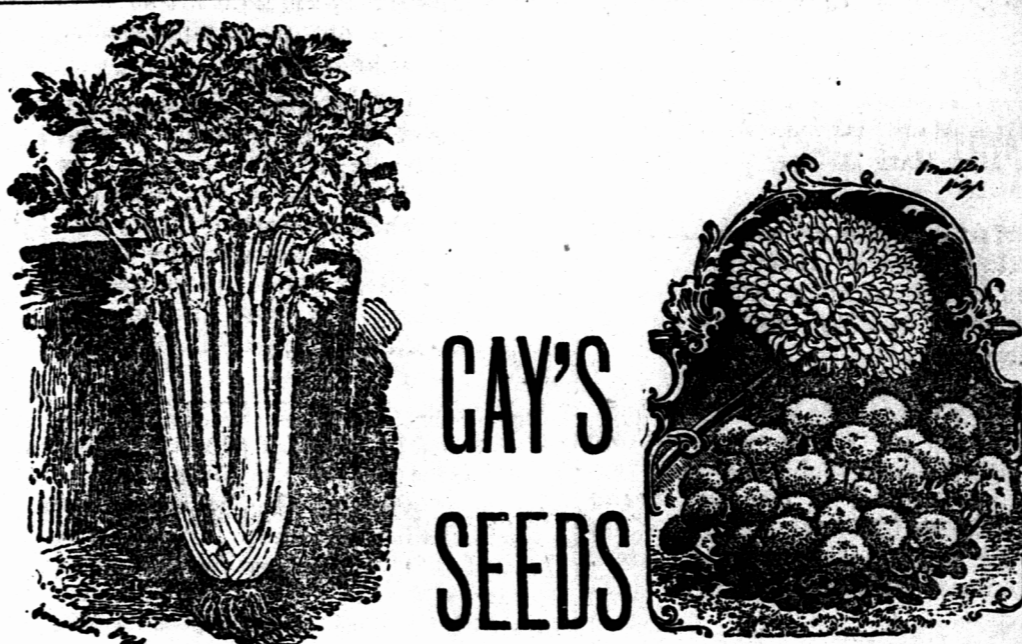

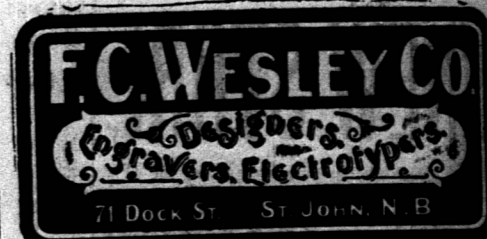
