London Favors Feminine Look In New Styles

LONDON, Aug. 18.—(CP)—London's Fashion Fortnight held last month, proved beyond doubt that the soft-shouldered, tight-waisted, and full-skirted silhouette is firmly established in Britain for another season at least with skirt lengths unchanged.

Jackets, however, are no longer very short but smoothly fitting and hip lengths with a different basque treatment in different houses. Skirt fullness is modified to great advantage, now being smoothly fitting over the hips but tapering out from there to a flared hem.

As a foil to these there are skirts with fullness varying from the all-round box pleats or knife pleated sections (usually back and front, leaving a smooth panel at the sides), loose unpressed pleats and gores. There are plenty of slim skirts, some showing a curved wrap-over.

Newspapers for 1948-49 are sweeping full length capes, elbow capes and caped coats, both occasionally with double tiers. Few loose back coats appear and those that are shown are less tent-like and sometimes have a negligible effect in back fullness.

Tight-Waisted Coats The majority of formal coats, however, are fitted closely to the waist with very full skirts often highlighted with bands of fur and trimming. Collars are high and important, often with a Regency effect, sometimes stiff and military in look.

Wools are predominant in soft color combinations, in striped, checked and flecked designs and in small indefinite patterns. Velours, soft woolsens, velvets, corduroys and suitings are popular and the lightweight woollen suit with a matching heavier weight topcoat is a definite feature.

Molyneux favors the very slim narrow shouldered silhouette with hip folds at the front and back. He, like Martini, suggests the lower hip line on many of the day dresses shown. The Digby Morton collection is notable for a slightly higher waist and for much more detail, collars running to a point at center back and panel seaming above the waist.

The princess line is important in the Peter Russell collection and slim elegant dresses are worn with matching or contrasting coats in heavier weight woolsens with elbow or three-quarter turned back sleeves.
