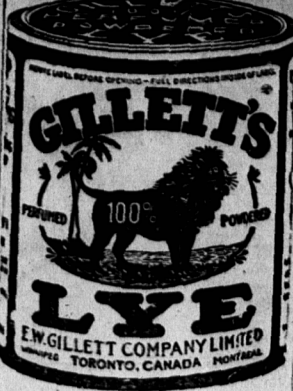

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Inter-Imperial Co-operation And Commercial Union (BY W. L. COTTON)

This seems to be a good time for the Dominion of the British Empire to "get together," with the Mother Country, for the purpose of making an arrangement under which there may be mutual co-operation in production and trade to the great advantage of the British people. Just now all Europe and a large part of Asia are in a state of political, commercial and economic confusion; and the United States holds steady to its prohibitive or protective Customs duties. Consequently trade on a large and permanently profitable scale cannot be carried on with either Europe or Russia or the United States. There is however, a fair opportunity to do business in the cities of Japan and China. For the rest the countries comprising the British Commonwealth are the only ones that carry on business and trade in conditions that are at all favorable.

It will, therefore, better reward the commercial interests of Great Britain, Canada South Africa Australia, New Zealand, Newfoundland, India and the British West Indies to seek business among themselves, within the Empire.

It is an inter-imperial trade arrangement were entered into Canada, lying midway between the East and the West, would occupy a position of transcendent importance. Her twenty-two thousand miles of National Railway (together with the Canadian Pacific Railway) with the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans, would carry East and West to the best markets the products of her farms, forests, mines and factories. These railways would also be the carriers of goods to and from China and Japan in the East, Australia and New Zealand in the South, and Great Britain, Newfoundland, and the West Indies in the West.

As it is of the first importance to Canada that her railways shall become self-sustaining so it is of the first importance that traffic to the East and the West shall not be diverted into the United States. Efforts to that end should therefore cease. Instead of lowering the tariff on goods from the United States and the world at large to the loss of revenue and the detriment alike to Canadian farmers and manufacturers, the people of Canada, with their railway directors and their Governments and Parliaments should unite on the promotion of industrial and commercial co-operation with the other members of the world wide Commonwealth to which they belong.

A British commonwealth, though every part of the British Empire, the products of British Colonies in the tropics would be a preference were afforded—helping people living in the Northern and Southern Hemispheres; and the British countries North and South, could supply the things which each can produce to the best advantage and so meet the requirements of the others on terms that the people of no other country could supply them. And the Mother Country, would, with her stored-up capital command the extensive merchant marine, be enabled to maintain her proud position from sleep. ST. JOHN'S, Nfld., Feb. 12 — Railway and Steamboat traffic have been abandoned owing to severe midwinter conditions experienced in Newfoundland for many years. While the interior of the Island is isolated by deep snow and heavy frost, fierce gales along the coast have cut off communication with the outside.

The cold wave set in Saturday night, the temperature gradually slipping to 10 below zero in this city and 20 below interior points. The mail boat Kyle which left this port Saturday night for Louisbourg, N. S., has gone no further than the vicinity of St. Pierre, Miquelon, late today.

The vessel then reported by radio that she was having to fight with high seas running. The Kyle has been three days covering half of a trip usually made in 24 hours.

As a result of the difficulties of navigation tremendous ice floes are reported off the eastern coast and the Grand Banks are seriously impeding all ocean shipping.
