After graduating from the University of Manitoba in 1887 he attended the University of Cambridge and continued his medical studies in hospitals in London, Dublin and Marburg, Germany. He served for a time as professor of pathology and bacteriology at the University of Manitoba and in 1895 accepted a similar position at the University of Minnesota. In 1906 he became dean of the medical college of the University of Minnesota.
