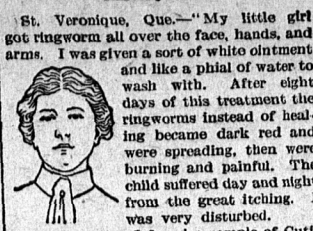

THE STEAMERS MAIL.—The mail special from Georgetown arrived in Charlottetown yesterday afternoon at 12.40.

THE ICE BOATS.—On Monday morning at 7.45, 8 boats left Cape Traverse and arrived in Cape Tormentine at 12.15 with 62 sacks mail at 7.15, 4 boats left Tormentine and arrived in Cape Traverse at 11.30 taking over 32 sacks mail. Yesterday, the ice boats did not cross on account of the north east gales and the shale ice on the N. B. side.

THE STEAMERS.—On Monday morning the Earl Grey crossed over to Pictou taking over 105 tons freight, 5 sacks mail and 31 passengers, and arriving at Georgetown yesterday morning at 10.50 o'clock. The Minto remained at Georgetown and both boats made the usual crossing yesterday morning, the Minto docking in Pictou at 10.10 with 75 tons freight, 49 passengers and 21 sacks mail. The Earl Grey docked in Georgetown at 9.55 with 56 passengers, 102 tons freight and 100 sacks mail.

FORTY HOURS DEVOTION.—The Forty Hours Devotion opened in the Pro-Cathedral Charlottetown, yesterday morning at 9 o'clock. The Solemn High Mass of Exposition was celebrated by Father J. Gaudet, Hope River, with Father Frank McDonald as sub-deacon while Rev. Dr. G. J. McLeellan was master of ceremonies. His Lordship the Bishop was also present in the Sacristy. After the Mass there was a procession of the Blessed Sacrament during which the choir rendered the Pange Lingua. Immediately afterwards the Litany of the Saints was chanted. During the day about fifteen priests were engaged in hearing Confessions both in the main church and in the basement. Communion will also be distributed this morning in both the basement and the main church at the different masses. The first mass will be celebrated at 5.30 a.m. this morning and the celebrations will continue until 8 o'clock when the Mass Pro Pace will be sung. The devotion closes tomorrow morning.

NEW HOME.—Mr. Ernest Parkman, city, has been awarded the contract for erecting a residence on Grafton Street for Dr. G. F. Dewar, of Southport. The new house is to be 22x38 feet, two storeys high and up-to-date in every respect. The foundation and cellar will be of concrete, the floor of hardwood and the interior of cypress finish.

INTERESTING LECTURE.—For the benefit of the funds being raised to procure an X-ray machine for the Charlottetown Hospital, Rev. Dr. Walker of Rollo Bay on Monday night in the rooms of the C.M.B.A., Charlottetown, repeated the lecture he delivered at Souris not long since upon that subject of absorbing interest in his lecture. The reverend lecturer dealt with his matter in a lucid and attractive manner, and earned the hearty thanks on his audience. There were over a hundred present over whom Dr. W. J. McMillan presided.

I. O. G. T.—The third quarterly session of Greens County District Lodge, I. O. G. T., was held in the Methodist Church, Tribby, Winsloe South, on the 18th inst. Considering the state of the roads and the distance to be travelled by the delegates the meeting was very successful and much enjoyed by the members present. The usual business was conducted with dispatch by the popular District Chief Templar, Brother Jonathan West. While some of the lodges gave splendid and encouraging reports, others were less favorable and some have dropped out entirely. The work of the Temperance Alliance was heartily endorsed and the sentiment was expressed by several members for all present to help in every way they could to win the victory. The public meeting in the evening was largely attended. Rev. W. P. McVie of Pownal was the principal speaker, gave an address which was a feast of thought in the temperance cause. Rev.
