### WINTER AT LAST IN NORTHWEST

WINNIPEG, Jan. 25.—Western Canada had its first experience with genuine winter during the last few days. In that period there has been a realistic imitation of the blizzard that has made the Dakotas famous. There were periods last night and today when the wind hit up a clip that came close to fifty miles an hour, and laboring Winnipeg was forcibly reminded that there had been something doing in the snow line when it waded into drifts that blocked the sidewalks. The snow-fall has been light, however, considering the length of the period which the storm has continued. The area affected is large, however, extending from Swift current to Kenora and from the Canadian boundary on the south to Battleford.
