PROPERTY
The property of the Company consists of leases for oil and gas of about 25,000 acres of the best oil lands in the Lake Ainslie District, County of Inverness, Cape Breton. 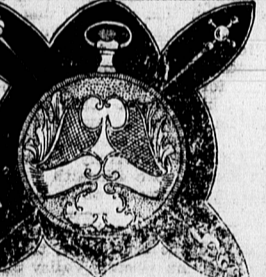
