HALIFAX, Feb. 20 (CP)—A Dartmouth curling club four composed exclusively of curlers from Manitoba and Ontario won the right tonight to represent Nova Scotia in the Dominion Bonspiel.

The team from the other side of Halifax Harbor, employing the Western "knockout" style of play, went through the three-day bonspiel with the loss of a single match.

The winners skipped by F. W. Heath of Killarney, Man., took an extra end tonight to shove out S. S. Rafuse's Bridgewater crew. They were tied 11-11 at the end of the regular play.

Heath heads a group composed of Mate Duncan Campbell, who played with Thistles of Hamilton, Ont., when they won the Dominion Spiel in 1935; L. A. Adamson of Newdale, Man., and L. D. Hopkins of Manitoba. All are employed in and near Dartmouth.

Maple Leafs Regain First Place With 2-1 Win Over Flying Frenchmen

TORONTO, Feb. 20 (CP)—Toronto Maple Leafs went back on top of the National Hockey League standing tonight by beating Montreal Canadiens 2-1 in a rugged contest before 10,656 customers.

Nick Metz broke up the game when he scored from a scramble in front of Canadiens' net half-way through the third period. The visitors were shorthanded at the time, with Ray Gelfin off for boarding.

Charlie Sands gave Canadiens the lead at 10:41 of the first period when he blasted the puck past Turk Broda after escaping from a Leaf power-play. Sands was partially stopped by Syl Apps but picked up his stride to finish off a good effort in stellar style.

Sweeney Schriner tied the count some five minutes later when he beat goalie Bert Gardiner with a withering drive that caught the far corner of the net. The puck hardly left the stick.

Bill Taylor engineered the play, slipping a rink-wide pass to his teammate to figure in Schriner's 21st goal of the season.

It was the sixth defeat for the sixth-place Canadiens at the hands of Toronto this season. One other meeting ended in a deadlock.
