THE TRADE BLOCKADE.

The attention of the Government, of Parliament, of shippers and business men on both sides of the Strait and throughout Canada, is directed to a letter which appears on our first page today. It was not intended for publication, but in the public interest The Guardian is permitted to print so much of it as is of public concern. It tells the story of the freight blockade in plain dispassionate words.

The Minto was at the time of writing, having her second cargo for Charlottetown, six days after the Northumberland made her last trip for the season. During the season of the open navigation some fifteen steamers and a fleet of schooners and coasters are engaged in the Island trade. Two of those steamers make round trips daily, either of them carrying about twice the cargo of the Minto. All this traffic is now stopped, and we have the Minto in their stead, and she, as the Pictou correspondent tells, can only take the way freight, express and baggage.

Meanwhile freight is piling up at Pictou and Charlottetown, our merchants waiting for their Christmas goods and our shippers unable to fill their orders for meats, poultry and produce, which are piled up here. Such is the result of the cruel denial by the Government of the third steamer that was solemnly and repeatedly promised us. Comment is useless. The facts speak for themselves, but they only feebly express the indignation of our people at the treatment accorded them.

THE BEET SUGAR INDUSTRY.

Two beet sugar factories were established in Ontario in 1902, and in the following year another was built at Raymond in Alberta. The business developed quite rapidly as shown by the following official figures:

In the four years there was paid to farmers for beets \$1,142,961 and to employees in wages \$325,045. The value of sugar manufactured was \$2,728,853. While this industry is thus growing in the west it is not yet started in this Province. Prince Edward Island, sadly in need of new industries, ought at least to grow its own sugar.

It is pleasing to note that our City schools have contributed handsomely to the fund being raised in the schools of Canada as a memorial to the late Alexander Muir of Toronto, the teacher, poet and author of "The Maple Leaf Forever."

WINTER FREIGHT IS BLOCKADED

Letter From Pictou States The Facts—The Minto Can Only Take The Way Freight And Baggage—Urgent Need of Another Winter Steamer at Once

Here is an extract from a letter received by a prominent business man in Charlottetown from a well-known business man in Pictou, which speaks for itself:

"Pictou, Dec. 13, 1906.
We have 45 carloads of freight here for Prince Edward Island. The Minto can only take the way freight, express and baggage. She is now loading up the second cargo that has gone to Charlottetown since last Friday. That is to say the Northumberland loaded up last Friday, the 6th, and this is only the second cargo that has been loaded up since. It is pretty difficult to get freight shipped under these conditions.

"We are only too glad to get it away if there is any boat to move it. If you had the Stanley here working instead of at Summerside playing we would have some show to get your goods forward. We hope however, to get a part forward next trip.

"The weather seems favorable for the Charlottetown route for a while. The Northumberland had all she could do to treatment accorded them.

Season, 1906-1907

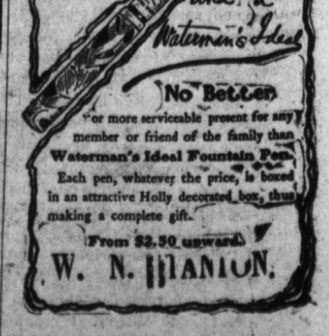
