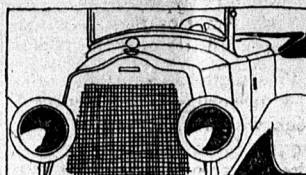
## HINTS FOR

### The Motorist

#### NON-GLARE LENSES SPOIL

##### DRIVING LIGHT



H. A. S. writes: The anti-glare lenses on my headlamps have cut down their lights so much that they are no good. What can be done about this?

Answer: Assuming that your lenses are correctly fitted, the only thing that you can do is to discard them for a better kind. There are approved lenses upon the market which do not affect the usefulness of headlamps to any such extent as yours seem to have done. Try a kind that is in successful use on other cars that come under your observation at night.

#### CHANGING FORD IGNITION

T. H. asked: Does it improve the operation and economy of a Ford car to replace the ignition system regularly furnished with it, by a standard magnet or battery system?

Answer: It may improve the engine's operation to do so, for it is not easy to secure perfect accuracy of ignition in all cylinders with the individual coil outfit that is standard equipment on these cars, while a good high-tension magnet or battery igniter insures this. Well synchronized ignition tends toward fuel economy, but we doubt if an improved magnet or battery system will show much better results as to fuel economy, then the separate coil system when at its best. It is of course difficult to keep the latter in perfect adjustment and some other form of ignition will be likely to give you less trouble. The timer regularly supplied upon these cars is in rather an inaccessible and vulnerable position and a substitution will better conditions in this regard. Moreover, it will leave the flywheel magnet for lighting purposes only, which may be an advantage.

#### ADJUSTING GENERATOR CHARGING RATE

P. writes: I know that my battery is getting too much charging current for I have to put in water altogether too often and sometimes the cells become quite hot. I am told there is a way of adjusting the generator to furnish less current. Please explain how. Mine is the electrical system.

Answer: In the generator you have voltage regulation is affected by the third brush method that is the generator field-coil is connected to the third or auxiliary brush at one end and to one of the main brushes at the other. Changing the position of the third brush on the commutator, so that the field coil obtains the voltage of a larger number of armature coils increases the charging rate and vice versa. You will have to obtain a detailed direction from the instruction book relating to this electrical system. In order to make the required adjustment intelligently and perhaps you may prefer to have it done at a service station. A very slight change of brush position makes a marked change in the charging rate and brush has to be fitted to the commutator to give a good contact in its new position.
