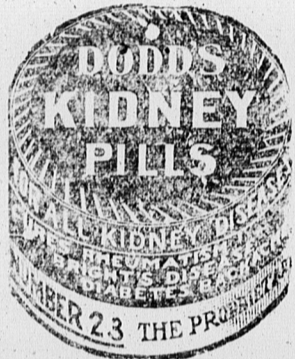
WESTERN GRAINGROWERS AND SIR WILFRID.

complete that thorough personal survey of the big Dominion to which he set himself when first assuming the office of Governor General. He early visited every Province and studied its natural resources of soil, forest, mineral or fishery wealth, and along with these made himself acquainted with the wants and wishes, the opinions and progress of the people. He is a keen and intelligent observer, and it is most assuring to find that the result of his extended travel and observations in Canada has greatly increased his love and admiration for the Dominion and its people. Lord Grey has also visited the United States, with which country our relations commercially and socially are so varied and extensive, and he appears to have impressed the people there as he has impressed the people of Canada, most favorably. He has gone home to the Mother Country and there to the open ears of the people high and low he has spoken in praise of Canada. He has, as an evident labor of love, done a great work in enthusiastic fashion and yet with rare good judgment and discrimination, in making Canada more widely and better known. For all of which he is recognized as standing in the front rank among the great men who have so far represented the Sovereign in this country. There are those who think that the Governor General of Canada should be a native born Canadian, yet who could name a Canadian who could or would have done so much in the past five or six years to advance the status and prestige of the Dominion as Lord Grey has done? Few Canadians have had either the natural qualities or the training for independent observation, or for the higher politics and diplomacy, which he has brought to the Empire, in such measure as these are possessed by Earl Grey, or the weight and influence that he has in imperial and international councils, and the few who possess a goodly measure of these gifts and acquirements are usually engaged and could ill be spared from their present useful activities. We are glad to know that Earl Grey is going to make a personal visit to Hudson Bay. That great Canadian sea and the projected route there through from the Northwest to the United Kingdom, on which Canada is contemplating the expenditure of many millions, is yet largely an unknown quantity, a rather perplexing problem. Lord Grey will bring to bear upon it his alert spirit of investigation and his safe and sane judgment. Whether he shall conclude that the project is chimerical or practicable and promising, his decision will carry great and determining weight in the minds of the people of Canada and among the capitalists of the Old World. Very much will depend thereupon.
