All the freight accumulated at Pictou has been taken across to P. E. Island. If ice and weather conditions continue favorable there is no reason to dread a recurrence of the congestion.—Pictou Advocate.

The last meeting of the New Glasgow Literary Society was one of the most successful of the series yet held. The meeting opened with the President, Artemus M. Tat in the chair. After usual preliminary proceedings the meeting took up the subject for discussion. The subject was a very interesting and inspiring one, "Who was the greatest military genius that the world has produced?"

In referring to the advance in pork the Maritime Merchant says: Pork is very firm at present high prices. Packers anticipate a further advance, but we do not think the market will stand much higher prices. If they reach a point where consumption is affected to any great extent packers will soon find themselves overstocked and will be forced to make concessions.

These figures of the total shipment of coal from the different Cape Breton collieries for last year have just been completed. The Dominion Coal Company's output was only a few tons short of the two million mark being 1,999,939 tons, an increase over the preceding year of 755,680 tons, the largest output in the history of the company. The N. S. Steel Co's (G.M. I.) output amounted to 217,458 tons, a decrease over the previous year of 3,911 tons. The North Sydney Mining Co's output totalled 9,300 tons.

Mr. George C. Cook, well known in Charlottetown as purser of the Halifax, Water Street commission merchant, was seen by the Merchant regarding the potato market. He reported local conditions rather promising for those who held stocks. Prince Edward Island potatoes had been advanced to 40c a bushel immediately after the first of the year and practically everybody is now selling at that figure. He thought the only factor which might weaken the market would be large arrivals of stocks from Prince Edward Island by rail but, as shipments from there in bags are somewhat dangerous at this season, it was scarcely probable that they would be attempted on a large scale. They stocks in Prince Edward Island ports are said to be large owing to the number of vessels which were late arriving there for cargoes and were consequently caught in the ice for the winter. One speculator told Mr. Cook that he had over four thousand dollars worth in two or three small vessels which are hard and fast in a Prince Edward Island harbor. In the town of Canso the supply is short to the amount of three cargoes which are still detained at Island ports. Of course as soon as spring opens or say about the first of April there will be a weakening in values, but in the meantime holders are not anxious to push business even at the price quoted. New Brunswick potatoes are worth from 45c to 47c.

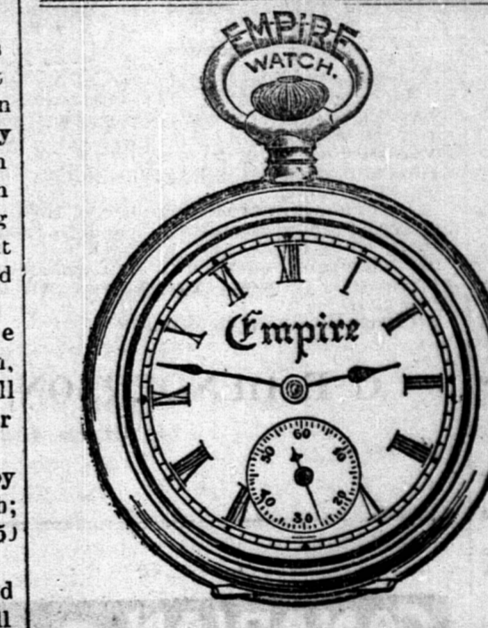
